Dear Madam:

We have received a letter from Kiyoshi MURAKI, Reg. #03964, of Port Credit, Ontario, in which he asks to have his cameras sent to him and asks us to hold his radio until he is able to have it shipped.

These cameras and radio are the articles that were surrendered by you on behalf of your father.

The radio has been sold. The funds are in your account but will be held until we receive from you and your mother the name of the owner of the radio.

If the cameras are the property of Kiyoshi Muraki, would you kindly write us and tell us so. If you and your mother will sign, we believe this will settle the question and enable us to release these cameras to your brother. If the cameras were the property of your father, but you wish to have these shipped to your brother, we know of no reason why this can not be done, if your mother gives her permission.

Will you kindly let us hear from you in regard to what your mother wishes us to do with the cameras and with the money received from the radio. A stamped, self-addressed envelope is enclosed for your reply.

Dear Sir:

Your letter of May 2nd, in regard to the radio and cameras surrendered by Miss Eiko Muraki on behalf of her father, has been received.

The radio has already been sold, but the cameras are in the hands of the Custodian and these will be held to give you an opportunity to make arrangements for shipment.

It will be necessary to have the permission of your mother to have this shipped, or to supply proof that the cameras are your property.

We suggest that you write the British Columbia Security Commission, supplying proof of your ownership of the cameras, and also the receipt from the police. At the same time you can arrange for payment of the shipping and packing charges.

We will write your sister in regard to ownership of the radio and cameras. If she and your mother advise us that these are your property, we shall pass your request for shipment on to the British Columbia Security Commission.

Dear Madam:

In reply to your letter of May 17th, we wish to advise that we understand cameras are released only to owners residing outside the housing settlements. However, we suggest that you get in touch with the British Columbia Security Commission supervisor, who will be able to tell you if there is any chance of your obtaining release of your camera.

In order that the camera may be shipped to your brother it will be necessary to send to the Commission the receipt received from the police. As the Custodian also requires this receipt in order that the money received from the sale of radios or cameras may be released, we suggest that you send the receipt to the Custodian, and advise the Commission that we have the receipt.

If you find that you cannot have your camera, you could advise the Commission that you wish both cameras shipped to your brother. The supervisor at Slocan will be able to advise you of what arrangements are necessary in order to have shipment made.

When we have received the receipt given to you by the police, the question of remitting funds from the proceeds of the sale of the radio will be taken up with the department handling funds.

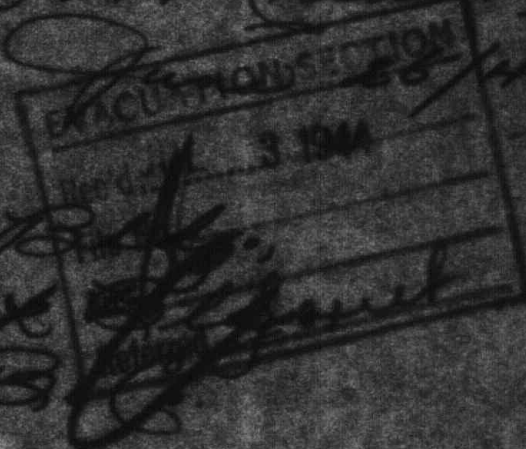

Dear Madam

We are in receipt of your letter of the 14th of July and also yours of the 26th of June, requesting us to forward \$25.00 to the Director of High School Correspondence, Department of Education, Victoria, B.C., but regret it has not been possible for us to do this.

The reason is that the money in your Father's account, namely \$150.00, which was paid by Mr. Shitzi Hsuda, for a debt owed, is not yet available, as, in the first place, there is an amount of \$80.00 owing to the B.C. Security Commission for funeral expenses in connection with your late Father and, further, we have received a request from your brother, Kiyoshi Hsuda, querying the amount due to the B.C. Security Commission, and also requesting the balance, namely \$70.00 to be forwarded to him.

We wrote your brother on the 20th of June on this matter, requesting him to agree to the payment to the B.C. Security Commission and asking him to sign a letter agreeing to the above, and also agreeing that we send the balance of the money to your Mother, Mrs. Tame Hsuda, but he has replied on the lines indicated above. By copy of this letter to your brother he will know that nothing has yet been done with regard to the money and we suggest that both you and your Mother write him and get the matter cleared up. As no will was left by your Father no action can be taken by us in this matter unless it is agreed by your brother, so please note that we shall do nothing further until we hear from your brother and yourselves. If your brother agrees to our sending the \$25.00 to Victoria then of course we will do so, as we note that your Mother has already agreed to this being done.

We think the matter of the \$80.00 funeral expenses to the B.C. Security Commission should be agreed without delay, but as mentioned, we will await replies to this letter.
