The following claims are revealed on file as being lodged against the above Japanese:

1. Dr. J. W. Thomson \$35.00
2. Albert Ashbridge (rent) \$10.00

On writing to Mr. Hagino under date of January 28, 1943 he replied on February 8th, 1943, admitting that he owed money to Dr. Thomson. This was paid from funds in Mrs. Hagino's (wife) account number 11527, which money was derived from the sale of their washing machine, and receipted account from Dr. J. W. Thomson is on file dated August 25, 1943.

In his letter of February 8, 1943, Mr. Hagino denied that he owed rent to Mr. Ashbridge and stated that at the time of evacuation they had reached a mutual agreement regarding settlement of rent. The Creditor was advised accordingly and a note on the Claims Memorandum dated March 4, 1943 indicates that the creditor advised that we need take no further action regarding the above claim of \$10.00

CLAIMS ACCORDINGLY CLOSED.

From information supplied by the Confederation Life Association, this Evacuee and his wife, Teruo, had a joint life insurance policy, No. X356,784, having an annual premium of \$64.79. On October 5th, 1943 an amount of \$20.00 was paid from funds in the account of Mrs. Teruo Hagino (wife) to the Confederation Life Association, representing part payment on the premium due under the above contract. No further information regarding this policy appears on either the wife's or husband's file and no action has been taken by the Custodian in connection with this policy.


An extract on file dated June 5, 1942 from a letter written by Walter A. Jacklin & Co. reveals that the above Evacuee holds 4 shares in Associated Cleaners & Dyers Limited (file 7822). According to a letter on file 7822 by Walter A. Jacklin & Co. the Shinbashi shares, namely 3, were transferred to Hagino on February 16, 1939, thus making a total of 7 shares in Rinzo Hagino's name as set out in the Petition on file dated December 26, 1945. An Order appointing Walter A. Jacklin as Liquidator of Associated Cleaners & Dyers was registered on January 18, 1946, and in a letter dated May 11, 1942, on file 7822 the Custodian advised Walter A. Jacklin that we had no objection to their making payment of funds in connection with shares in the above Company direct to the Japanese.

Accounts Receivable:

An amount of \$8.31 was credited to Rinzo HAGINO'S account with the Custodian, representing refund of security deposit of light by the B. C. Electric Company Ltd. A cheque for the above amount is being remitted to Mr. Hagino, as per requisition on file dated October 25, 1946.

NO OTHER PROPERTY OF ANY KIND WHATSOEVER BELONGING TO THE ABOVE JAPANESE PERSON IS REVEALED ON THIS FILE.

Dear Sir & Madam:

Your letter of November 6th has been received. We are puzzled by the section of your letter dealing with your household effects. Our records give the following information in regard to your household effects:

The washing machine declared by Mrs. Hagino was sold at your request for the sum of \$55.00. From these funds, we paid \$35.00 to Dr. James W. Thomson in full settlement of his claim, and the sum of \$20.00 was paid to the Confederation Life Insurance Company on October 4, 1943 to apply on premium in connection with Policy X35678A. Both payments were made at your request.

The remainder of the household effects found at 2252 West 3rd Avenue, Vancouver, as shown by the inventory sent to you on November 17, 1942, were stored by the Custodian. On December 6, 1943 these goods were turned over to the British Columbia Security Commission for shipment to Mrs. Hagino at Tashme.

The five boxes reported to have been left in the care of Mrs. Kirkpatrick, 2426 West 6th Avenue, were shipped to Mrs. Hagino, at Tashme, on August 20, 1943, according to information on file.

No property identified as belonging to you remains under the control of the Custodian.

No funds are standing to the credit of your accounts with this office. Both accounts have been closed.
