Dear Sir:

We wrote to you on November 29, 1946, regarding the claim of \$1.94 filed against you by the B. C. Telephone Company. We stated in this letter that unless we heard from you by January 6, 1947, we would assume you wished us to settle this claim for you from funds standing to your credit with this office. We have had no reply to this letter, and are therefore remitting a cheque to the B. C. Telephone Company today in full payment of their claim. This leaves a balance of \$53.64 in your account. However we cannot release these funds to you until we receive the receipt which you were given by the Royal Canadian Mounted Police at the time you surrendered your radio. As you have not sent us this receipt, we assume it has been lost. We therefore enclose a declaration stating that the receipt has been lost, which we would ask you to sign and return to this office. As soon as we have received the signed declaration we will remit your funds to you. We enclose a stamped addressed envelope for your convenience.

On receipt of your letter of the 21st inst. denying the claim of the Telephone Co. for \$5.44 we took the matter up with them and have received reply. We quote from their letter as follows:

"We note his remarks but have no record of his having notified us to terminate his service, the telephone was cancelled by ourselves for non-payment of the August account. However, as this party was evacuated July 9th, 1942, and the July account was paid in full we feel that under the circumstances it will be quite in order for him to forgo the August rental \$3.50.

Corrected account is enclosed herewith in the amount of \$1.94. Trusting that the above explanation and adjustment will clear this matter satisfactorily with our former subscriber and that payment of \$1.94 will be forthcoming in the near future."

We enclose herewith their statement for your further information. It seems that they have met you more than half-way in regard to this account, and if you now agree that it is correct you may authorize us to pay same from your credit balance with the Custodian. On receipt of such instructions we shall settle the claim in your behalf.

Dear Sir:

Your file with this office has been reviewed, and the following information is revealed.

Your account has been credited with the sum of \$15.43 representing the net proceeds from the sale of chattels identified as your property.

Your account has been credited with \$9.47 as net proceeds from the sale of the motor-vehicle registered in your name.

The sum of \$30.68, being the net proceeds from the sale of a radio reported to have been surrendered by you is being held here. If you will send us the receipt given to you at the time the radio was surrendered, we will place this sum to your credit.

These three sums would bring your credit balance to \$55.58.

Your file shows that the claim filed against you by the B. C. Telephone Company is still unsettled. This claim covers long distance and inter-exchange charges for the period from June 20, 1942 to July 20, 1942, and amounts to \$1.94. We have referred this claim to you before but have not received a reply from you. Unless we hear from you by January 6, 1947, we shall assume that you wish us to settle this claim from your funds, and it will be paid.

We shall then remit to you the remainder of the funds from the sale of your motor-vehicle and chattels. If you will send us the radio receipt this would enable us to send you also the \$30.68 received from the sale of the radio.

LIABILITY SUMMARY

RE: Tobei HAYASHI, Reg. No. 09374

A claim in the sum of \$5.44 was filed against the above by the N.C. Telephone Co. on Nov. 4/42. In reply to our letter enquiring about this debt HAYASHI advised us in his letter of May 21/44 that he owed the telephone company nothing but that the tenants who lived in their place after they left had let the telephone stay in the name of HAYASHI for two months and that these tenants had asked him how much they owed for these two months. We advised the telephone company of this in our letter of May 25/44 and they sent us in a new statement saying that they would forego the rental for the one month and would deduct this \$3.50 from the account, but the balance which was owing for long distance and inter-exchange calls made by HAYASHI in the sum of \$1.94, was still owing. We wrote to HAYASHI again on May 29/44 giving him a revised bill and asking him to authorize us to pay same from his credit with this office. No reply has been received to this letter.
