
On May 8th, 1942 the above Japanese person signed our Form J card certifying that she had no property of any kind whatsoever in any protected area in British Columbia.

Accounts
Receivable:

On September 4, 1942 Mrs. Haramoto signed an "Additional Registration" in which she stated that a number of people were indebted to her for a total amount of \$291.16. On the death of the above Evacuee correspondence in connection with these debtors was carried on with the husband, on his file 13877. However, we were only able to collect \$9.66, which amount was credited to Mrs. Haramoto's account and subsequently applied on account of a claim lodged against this Evacuee by Dr. D. E. Starr.

Re: Accounts Receivable.

With reference to our letter to you of September 15th, 1943 we would advise that we have very little to add relative to the collection of the accounts declared by the late Mrs. Haramoto in her Additional Registration dated September 4th, 1942.

On May 11th, 1944 we wrote to Mrs. Cuthbert again in an effort to collect the balance owing, namely \$26.15, but she replied on May 17th stating that her husband was a seaman in the Royal Canadian Navy and her allowance would not enable her to pay any debts. She advised, however, that if at any time she was able to forward a remittance, she would do so, but nothing further has been received in connection with this account.

As advised you in our letter of September 15th, 1943, we were only able to collect the sum of \$9.66 and in accordance with your letter of September 8th, 1943 we have applied the above amount on one of the claims against you, namely that of Dr. D. E. Starr, thus reducing his claim to \$20.34 and leaving no funds in the account of your late wife.
