



PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

This file reveals that TSUJI owned no real property in any protected area of B.C. and did not carry any Fire Insurance.

CHATELS:

TSUJI made his declaration to the Custodian on Jan. 27/44 and was evacuated on March 10/42.

He declared chattels as shown on the Chattel Schedule at 325 W. 4th Ave. A number of people left chattels at this address and very few of them were marked with the names of the owners, as the Japanese did not expect these goods to be moved from this address. Most of the chattels were sold under the name of the owner, Mr. Mitsuo YAGI, File 8614.

After corresponding with Mr. YAGI and other Japanese who left their chattels at this address, the goods which could be identified as belonging to each of them were credited to their respective accounts. Chattels have been credited to TSUJI as shown on Chattel Schedule on file. These were sold for the net sum of \$17.98 and this sum credited to his account with the Custodian.

The stove, 2 carpets and carpenter's square declared by TSUJI were not found by the Custodian.

The aluminum tea pot would appear to have been shipped, although there is no receipt from the B.C.S.C. showing receipt of this article for shipment.

ACCOUNTS
RECEIVABLE:

The account of TSUJI was credited with the sum of \$5.15, being a refund of 1% wage deductions for the first six months of 1941.

The camera which Mrs. TSUJI surrendered to the R.C.M.P. was mailed to her on Dec. 20/45. The costs of packing and mailing in the sum of 21¢ were deducted from the account of her husband, leaving a credit, at that time, of \$4.94 in his account. This small balance was paid to him prior to his repatriation to Japan.

No property interests other than those mentioned above are found on this file.

Re: Chattels at 325 West 4th Avenue

T. Yagi's letter of February 2nd on file 11768 gives the following information:

(1) Practically everything without names belongs to Mr. K. Tsuji. The linoleum laid in the room where the chattels are stored and belonging to Mr. Tsuji is omitted from our list of January 26th.

(2) Other items are marked with the name of Tetsuzo Sawa. He has now registered and most of his articles seem to appear on the list found by Mr. Logan except the bicycle.

(3) Still other articles belonging to S. Waki-kawa are so marked according to the Japanese, possibly in Japanese writing, so that Mr. Logan was unable to identify them.

(4) The electric range belonging to T. Yagi is confirmed as being his and his other belongings "are locked up in the junk room downstairs". Most of his articles are not marked as they were not meant to be moved. He claims linoleum still scattered through the house.

Now that Mr. Hen has taken over, I think we should confirm that he understands the arrangements and that the rooms where the things are stored are safely locked up. In this connection, I thought you pointed out to me the electric range when we were in 604 the other day, in which case you may have moved some or all of these things. I think a record should also be kept of the "linoleum still scattered through the building, among them the large new green piece in the top building, far end room." Would you see that a brief memorandum describing the current position is put on all four files?
