Dear Sir:

This Commission is in receipt of a copy of your letter of the 20th instant addressed to the Officer Commanding, R. C. M. Police, Vancouver, in which you state that some Japanese are still living at Mission and that you desire the names, registration numbers and also the dates when these Japanese will be evacuated from Mission.

You are probably aware that the task of evacuating Japanese is one for this Commission and your letter requesting this information would have been more properly addressed to us. As a matter of fact, for your information, your office was informed of these people by Constable Davidson of the R. C. M. Police a week ago today and there should have been no necessity therefore for further enquiries of the R. C. M. Police.

However, in case the information already given you has been mislaid will you please be advised that the Japanese in question is a Japanese woman married to a white man and who has some Eurasian children and these people are all exempted from the restrictions regarding Japanese. There is therefore no necessity for your office to be connected in any way with these people.

Thank you very much indeed for your letter dated November 27th. Mr. Koasi Fujikawa registered his assets with the Custodian on August 18th, 1942 and in consequence his assets vested in the Custodian as from that date.

Our records indicate that this Mr. Fujikawa was scheduled to leave the protected area on August 1st, 1942 but received a permit to rejoin his family at R. R. No. 2, Mission, B. C., to be shipped from there. At the time Mr. Fujikawa registered his assets with us he declared that he had left a box of mechanic's tools valued at approximately \$200.00 at the address given and during the course of their protection work our field men called at R. R. No. 2, Mission and were there informed that the box of tools had been forwarded by a Miss Fujikawa to her brother.

Our field men having reported that Japanese were living at the address given, we wrote to the R.C.M.P. on November 20th calling this matter to their attention. The report from Constable Davidson mentioned in your letter may very well have reached this office at the time you indicate but I was unaware of such a report and have still not seen any such report from Constable Davidson.

Dear Sir:

Referring to your letter of the 25th March in which you state you are buying land within what was declared "the restricted area" in 1942.

Order-in-Council P.C. 1457 states that it is deemed advisable to regulate the acquisition of land and no person of the Japanese race shall acquire land unless he receives a license from the Minister of Justice.

More recently under Order-in-Council P.C. 5973 the consent of the Minister of Labour was required in place of that of the Minister of Justice. The Order-in-Council also makes it an offence to enter into any sales agreement with a person of the Japanese race.

From the information we have in our office therefore it would appear that before you can enter into any purchase arrangement you will need to secure a license from the Minister of Labour. Doubtless at that time if a license is granted the question of the property vesting in the Custodian would be a matter for consideration.
