The above was evacuated on March 12, 1942 and signed a declaration to the Custodian to the effect that he had no property of any kind, at Hastings Park on July 11, 1942.

A Custodian Release form was removed from this file to his wife's file on 9/10/46. All the chattels were declared by the wife and administered on her file. FILE 6774.

A refund of 1 $\frac{1}{2}$  Wage Deduction for the period from January 1 to June 30, 1941 amounting to \$5.78 was received and is now being remitted to the Japanese.

This file reveals no other property.

The above summary is certified to be in accordance with the information on file.

Dear Sir:

Upon receiving your letter of the 10<sup>th</sup> instant, I have noticed that I have been informed, concerning the claims made by Komura Bros. in the amount of \$10.73, and by M. Furuya Co., in the amount of \$2.00 respectively. These claims are definitely outrageous, as the payments were paid in full prior to evacuation.

Amidst hurried packing and confusion at the time of evacuation, we have left practically all our household belongings behind, as the original receipts remain at Vancouver, B.C., preventing me from producing real evidence. However, it is my word against theirs, and if mine cannot be accepted as true, I would wish to seek the whereabouts of these company managers through your office aid, so as to have matters wind up for good. Furthermore, I do not wish to stir up complications arising from a matter of small sum, and I truly wish to have incorrect claims filed against me, justified.

I am also requesting you to send me the balance of \$5.78 credit derived from a refund of 1% Warage Deduction for the period from Jan 1 to June 1, 1941, as I am entitled to it.
