

In answer to your enquiry of September 17th we would advise that Life Insurance covering the lives of Evacuee Japanese is not vested in the Custodian.

However, as explained in our Form Letter No. 112, we would be willing to assist your Japanese policyholders in maintaining their policies, by payment of premiums under the following circumstances:

- a. Providing that they request us to do so; and also
- b. Providing that we have funds to their credit which can be made available for such a purpose.



Mrs. Mori, one of the lives insured under the above numbered policy, showed us your form letter #118 dated August 30, 1943 and asked whether this meant that their policy was under the control of the Custodian. We were not exactly sure what the answer to this enquiry should be, since we were aware that this policy, to a certain extent, was subject to the Trading With the Enemy Regulations. We were under the impression, however, that the policy was not under the control of the Custodian of Enemy Property and, if that is true, we should very much appreciate your confirmation so that we may advise our policyholder.
