R.C.M.P. information reports this man as the owner of a truck. As we have no records of this man owning a truck and as he did not declare one we assume he disposed of his truck prior to date of surrender of motor vehicles.

We shall be obliged if you will let us know if these claims are correct or otherwise at the present time. If they are correct please forward remittance to settle same. If you cannot do this let us know what the prospects are for payment in the near future.

The file of Sotaro YAMASAKI indicates that while operating as Maru Koshi Transfer he had a claim against the Kawade Box Co. for \$16.15. However, we assume that this has been settled as our several letters to him have brought us no reply, and we are not considering it at the present time.

There is a balance of \$27.28 standing to your credit with this office at the present time. This amount was received as the net proceeds from the sale of a Victor Consol radio surrendered by you to the Royal Canadian Mounted Police. If you will send in to this office the receipt given to you at the time the radio was surrendered we will be in a position to release these funds.
