Dear Mademi

We are in receipt of yours of the 17th instant with reference to an accident at the butcher shop at Tashme in which you inform us that you lost all the fingers of your left hand.

This is a matter which would come under the supervision of the Jupanese Division of the Department of Labour as the Department which arranged for employment of persons of the spanese race. I assume that an assumt of vortinen's compensation has been determined and that if you are not yet receiving this you have been kept on maintenance and compensation will assume to you and be adjusted after the official cessation of hostilities.

If you determine to go to Japan on a voluntary basis I assume that a commutation might be made and a lump sum paid. However, as stated above, it will be necessary for you to deal directly with the Department of Labour in regard to this matter.
