Married to Mitsuzo Fujimaga in 1918, divorced in 1938. Had four children in first marriage, one of these children is living with this registrant, the other three are residing with the father.

Married Yasushi Nishihara July 24th 1939, and has had no children in second marriage. This is Yasushi Nishihara's second marriage also; four children were born during first marriage (one deceased). His first wife died in 1931. The three children are at present living with him.

The surname is claimed to have been legally secured through marriage to Mitsuzo Fujimaga, whom she claims to have married in 1918 and divorced in 1938. The birth certificate of one child, at present living with the mother verifies the marriage of Mitsuzo Fujimaga to Aiko Komiyama. The given name Aiko is claimed to have been voluntarily adopted.

This registrant claims to be the wife of Yasushi Nishihara. She possesses a certificate from the Japanese Consul in Vancouver which states that the said Yasushi Nishihara married Yoo Fujimaga on July 24th 1939. This registrant has also produced a Japanese Passport No. 139099, in the name of the latter.

Child - James Atsaku Fujimaga - July 23, 1931.

Passport gives given name as Yoo, which is not an optional translation of Japanese.
