PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

File No. 11359

March 28, 1947

Re: Shozo NISHIYAMA, Reg. No. 08041

This man signed a declaration on July 13, 1942. According to information received from the RCMP NISHIYAMA was evacuated on March 6, 1942, but as his declaration was signed in Vancouver, it would appear that he must have returned to Vancouver to assist his wife at the time of her evacuation. Mrs. NISHIYAMA was evacuated on September 10, 1942.

XX In his declaration, NISHIYAMA reported ownership of no chattels, but his wife did declare goods at 992 Powell Street. Goods found at 992 Powell Street were sold in the name of Shozo NISHIYAMA. The net proceeds from the sale of goods declared by Mrs. NISHIYAMA and sold in the name of Shozo NISHIYAMA were \$65.17. In addition, a table, a stool and a chair identified as the property of Shozo NISHIYAMA were discarded as of no value. Goods not accounted for in the list of chattels declared by Mrs. NISHIYAMA are 1 kitchen chair, 1 cupboard. A quantity of goods were sold in the name of Shozo NISHIYAMA, but could not be identified on the list of goods reported by his wife. On December 19, 1946, we wrote and asked this couple if the goods reported by Mrs. NISHIYAMA covered all the goods they had stored at 992 Powell Street. We received no reply, so it has been assumed that these other articles were the property of other persons, and the proceeds of the sale of these has been placed in Chattel Suspense account.

NISHIYAMA declared one \$5.00 War Savings Certificate, two \$100.00 Victory Bonds, A Monarch Life Insurance Co. policy and a Standard Life Assurance Co. policy as well as a retirement pension bond. None of these items were brought under the control of the Custodian. Cheque for cash value of the Monarch Life policy was sent to NISHIYAMA on October 24, 1944, in the amount of \$37.26.

NISHIYAMA reported that he owned 25 shares in Furuya Co., 318 Powell Street. No funds have been paid in to his account in this office from the liquidation of this company.

On April 15, 1943, we sent to NISHIYAMA a cheque for \$4.90 representing funds received as refund of one per cent wage deductions for the first six months of 1941.

No other property of any kind is revealed by this file.




