

We have for acknowledgment your letters of the 20th and 27th instant with reference to your outstanding debts and collections, and in reply we must inform you that we are not a collection agency.

When you registered with this office you submitted a list of debts whose debts to you totalled approximately \$7000.00. This list is dated July 20th, 1942, over four years ago, and we would like to know if you have collected any of these accounts yourself.

Where we have been able to ascertain the whereabouts of the debtor, we have written to him on your behalf, but if they fail to reply, or express inability to pay, or repudiate the debt, there is nothing we can do about it.

Since you are better acquainted with the circumstances under which these debts were incurred than we are, we would suggest that you are in a better position to effect their collection in order to apply this money against your own liabilities. I have written to you twice requesting you to make payments on debts which I owe. Up to this date I had not heard from you so I took for granted that you had made these payments for me, but to-day I have received a letter from Mr. S. Kawaguchi of Kelowna, asking me to make payments on the debt I owe him. In Mr. Kawaguchi's letter, he enclosed a copy of a letter sent to him from Mr. G.B. Spain of your office, stating that your office is unable to assist him because I had returned to Japan. This is to inform you that I am still in Canada and that I wish you to make payments on all my debts on a percentage basis as requested previously.

On reading Mr. Spain's letter, (enclosed by Mr. Kawaguchi) I was of the impression that you will not pay my debts on my repatriation to Japan. This letter was dated July 6, 1946. I am in receipt of a letter from Mr. W.J. Johnston, also of your office, requesting further information on a debt owing me. This letter was dated July 16, 1946, ten days later, at which time you are still endeavouring to make collections on my claims when you had believed I had repatriated to Japan. Please advise me what you are going to do with the money collected in my favour if you are not going to pay my debts for me.

On any further collections, please use the money to pay my debts on a percentage basis.

I am enclosing a copy of this letter to Mr. Kawaguchi for his information and in earnest hope that you will act accordingly and thus satisfy all parties concerned.

Received your letter of dated 7th of Sept. that you are holding the cheque amount \$175.⁰⁰ from New York Life Assurance Co. Please pay it to S. Kawaguchi, R.R. No. 2, Kelowna, B.C. which I owe him very much. I was asked to pay the sum as soon as possible on account for he was in the hospital recently. Send me \$65.⁰⁰ which you have corrected from my estimate. We want to fix our family teeth and plates on account of indigestion, and want to buy some nourishment.

In your letter you have stated that claims amounted \$1800.⁰⁰ but it seems to me incorrect. I know I owe S. Kawaguchi approximately \$1130.⁰⁰

For Macaskey Recalls & Martland Rents let about \$200.⁰⁰ which is several years ago. Since I rented his premises I had to pay the water rates amounted \$30.⁰⁰ & this should be paid by

the house owner. I talked with him several times but did not satisfactorily answer for Melne & Middleton his claim of \$185⁰⁰ is about 15 years ago. even old I know & owed him. About \$175⁰⁰ recent account. He told me to bring some merchandise to square it up before I vacate, and he'd in some merchandise since then I wished to do some more but impossible, and took too long to vacate & not work and spend nearly all my money. I can't know want to pay it if I can. So as I vacate before please pay \$175⁰⁰ to S. Kawaguchi and \$35 to me. 
