With reference to the list of Accounts Receivable, filed by your company with the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee on April 30, 1942, on which is shown,

INOUE, Kandaye \$473.50 - Unsecured debt,

and the statement, filed with the Custodian on November 30, 1942, giving details of your claim, we wish to advise that, while we have no record of a Kandaye INOUE, we do have a record of Kandayu INOUE, self-employed fisherman, formerly of 251 Powell Street, Vancouver, who is probably the man referred to in your claim.

In the event that your claim is still outstanding, we regret to advise that we have no funds belonging to this man, and no knowledge of any assets belonging to him. Although he registered as a self-employed fisherman, we have no record of him as a boat-owner.

If the claim has already been settled, or if you are successful in obtaining payment, let us know. Kandayu INOUE's address is, Slocan Extension, B. C.

In the meantime, your claim will be filed against Kandayu INOUE, but unless some assets come to light, we will be unable to do anything toward the collection of this account.
