
Please note that the above has been repatriated to Japan. At the time of repatriation, the following transactions took place:

GENERAL SUMMARY

File No. 11439 Fujio YAMAMOTO Reg. No. 15087

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on July 15, 1942. He was evacuated on September 8, 1942. In his declaration he stated that he owned no property of any kind left in the protected area.

The radio and camera, shown on Specified Articles Memorandum, were surrendered to the Royal Canadian Mounted Police and were turned over to the Custodian by the Police on December 17, 1943. The radio was sold and the net proceeds of \$7.79 were credited to the account of Fujio YAMAMOTO. The camera was mailed to Fujio YAMAMOTO on November 26, 1945.

This file reveals no other property of any kind whatsoever. No liabilities are shown by this file.

Your letter of December 6th has been received. Thank you for advising us that your camera had reached you.

As we advised you on November 21st, your radio was sold for the net sum of \$7.79. Custodian cheque for this amount is enclosed herewith.

When you signed a declaration to the Custodian prior to your evacuation, you stated that you owned no property of any kind left in the protected area. Your radio and camera were reported to this office by the Royal Canadian Mounted Police to whom these articles had been surrendered. This office has no knowledge of any property, other than the radio and camera, belonging to you.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the protected area which vested in the Custodian and in order that you may confirm this and acknowledge the attached cheque, we enclose a stamped, addressed envelope.
