

Dear Sir & Madam:

The letter of February 2nd, written on behalf of Mr. ADACHI by Mr. K. TSUYUKI, has been received. In reply, we wish to inform you that the sewing machine about which you inquired has been sold. Your chattels were declared by both of you. The greater part of these chattels were shipped to you. A washing machine and a kitchen stove were sold on your behalf by the May Lumber Company, who sent to this office the proceeds from these sales, a total amount of \$85.00. This money was remitted to Mr. ADACHI in September and October, 1943. Chattels, identified as the property of Mr. ADACHI, were sold at auction by the Custodian and the net proceeds of the sale were credited to his account, in the amount of \$10.06. The sewing machine and a few small articles were sold by the Custodian for the net sum of \$77.79, which has been credited to the account of MRS. ADACHI. A carton of personal effects is stored in Custodian warehouse at Vancouver under the name of Mr. Minoru ADACHI.

The seven \$5.00 War Savings Certificates, bank account and life insurance policy, which were declared by Mr. ADACHI, did not come under the control of this office.

The total sum standing to your credit with this office, in the two accounts, is \$47.45. This money is available to you upon request.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the protected area which vested in the Custodian and, in order that you may confirm this, we enclose a stamped, addressed envelope for your convenience in replying.

In his declaration to the Custodian on July 15th, 1942, this man declared a quantity of household effects.

Of the articles declared, the sewing machine, a box of china and some frames were sold for the net sum of \$37.39 which has been credited to the account of his wife, File 10938. The washing machine and kitchen stove were sold by the Mayo Lumber Company for \$50.00 and \$35.00 respectively. These sums were credited to the account of Minoru ADACHI in this office and were later remitted to him. 2 tables, 2 chairs and 3 crocks were sold at Duncan Auction No. 6 for the net sum of \$10.06 which has been credited to the account of Minoru ADACHI. The remainder of the chattels declared were shipped to Mr. and Mrs. ADACHI.

He declared 7 - \$5.00 War Savings Certificates, in his own possession. These did not come under the control of this office.

He declared a bank account of \$260.00 in the Bank of Commerce, Duncan, B. C. This did not come under the control of this office.

He also declared a policy with the Manufacturers Life Insurance Company for \$1500.00. The policy was in his own possession at the time of his declaration and did not come under the control of this office.

Thank you for your letter dated June 11th.

Following receipt of your letter we have reviewed all of our files covering individuals of the Japanese race bearing the family name Adachi and then segregated those Adachis who at any time were in Paldi, B. C. From this remainder we have taken only those individuals who are presently in Tachoo.

From this remaining number we have reached the conclusion that Mr. Minoru Adachi, Police Registration No. 09026, a carpenter and blacksmith, who was previously employed by the Mayo Lumber Company in Paldi, B. C. and who is at present in Tachoo, is probably the individual entitled to receive War Savings Redemption Cheque No. B207924 in the amount of \$26.40 originally made payable to "F. Adachi". In support of this belief we find that on July 11, 1942 Mr. Adachi filed with Mr. J. A. Rose of the B. C. Security Commission, a request for the release of some baggage and signed said application "F. H. Adachi".

We would like to suggest that your local Treasury Representative in Tachoo ascertain whether or not Mr. Minoru Adachi was also known as F. H. Adachi and whether or not Mr. Minoru Adachi forwarded War Savings Certificates to Ottawa for redemption.

When Mr. Minoru Adachi registered his assets with the Custodian on July 15, 1942, he declared that he held seven \$5.00 War Savings Certificates.


Dear Sir,

This will acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 19th instant, wherein you refer to Cheque No. B207924 issued in favour of F. Adachi, Tashme, B.C. in the amount of \$16.40. We note that you desire further information regarding this individual.

We are unable to give you the full name of the person mentioned, as the only name on record is F. Adachi. Our records indicate that the War Savings Certificates covered by the above mentioned cheque were applied for through Mayo Bros. Timber Co. Ltd., Paldi, B. C. At the time applications for the certificates were submitted, the address of F. Adachi was given as Paldi, B.C. The address of Tashme, B.C. appeared in section three on the back of the certificates when they were forwarded for redemption.

We regret that this is all the information which we have on file, but trust that you may be able to trace this Japanese through Mayo Bros. Timber Company.

Replying to your letter of September 21st re
Minoru Adachi #09038.

We beg to advise that the Japanese formerly
living here stored their household goods in the Japanese
hall at Paldi, but just what was stored in this hall,
the Company has no way of knowing, as we were not given
a list or a record of each individual's personal property.

The understanding with Mr. T. Urabe, the Japanese
Foreman while working for this Company, was that they could
store their chattel in the hall and we would ship out any-
thing they ordered, if it was possible. Since then, we have
shipped considerable items to them as per instructions from
your office. Records of which we have here. But as to what
is left in the hall, we have no record.

We shipped for M. Adachi six pieces as per your
order dated July 27th signed by Mr. J.A. Rose of the B.C.
Security Commission.
