This woman signed a declaration to the Custodian on July 20, 1942. She was evacuated on September 10, 1942.

In her declaration, Mrs. HAGINO reported five boxes left in the care of Mrs. Kirkpatrick, 2426 West 6th Avenue, Vancouver. These boxes were turned over to the B. C. Security Commission for shipment on August 20, 1943.

MRS. HAGINO reported 3 boxes of various goods, 2 tables and two beds left at her former residence, 2252 West 3rd Avenue, Vancouver. These were removed to Custodian storage in September, 1942. On June 12, 1943, these articles were turned over to the B. C. Security Commission for shipment.

The washing machine declared by Mrs. HAGINO was sold at her request for the sum of \$55.00, which was credited to her account.

Mrs. HAGINO reported two Prudential Insurance Company policies on the lives of two of her children, Minoru and Sanae. These were not brought under the control of the Custodian.

On October 4, 1943 at the request of this woman and her husband, this office paid \$20.00 from Mrs. HAGINO's funds to the Confederation Life Co. to be applied on policy #X25678A, on the life of Mr. & Mrs. Rinzo HAGINO.

Your letter of November 6th has been received. We are puzzled by the section of your letter dealing with your household effects. Our records give the following information in regard to your household effects:

The washing machine declared by Mrs. Hagino was sold at your request for the sum of \$55.00. From these funds, we paid \$35.00 to Dr. James W. Thomson in full settlement of his claim, and the sum of \$20.00 was paid to the Confederation Life Insurance Company on October 4, 1943 to apply on premium in connection with Policy X356784. Both payments were made at your request.

The remainder of the household effects found at 2252 West 3rd Avenue, Vancouver, as shown by the inventory sent to you on November 17, 1942, were stored by the Custodian. On December 6, 1943 these goods were turned over to the British Columbia Security Commission for shipment to Mrs. Hagino at Tachino.

The five boxes reported to have been left in the care of Mrs. Kirkpatrick, 2426 West 6th Avenue, were shipped to Mrs. Hagino, at Tachino, on August 20, 1943, according to information on file.

No property identified as belonging to you remains under the control of the Custodian.

No funds are standing to the credit of your accounts with this office. Both accounts have been closed.

Mr. Rinso HAGINO has written this office as follows:

"I sent to you a receipt, which I received from the Custodian for my household effects in hope that you will send them to me, but I have not heard from you or anything about it for over a year. Could you please let me know why I received no answer?"

According to our records, all household effects declared by either of these people were found by the Custodian, and, with the exception of a washing machine sold at their request, all their effects were turned over to Mr. W. D. Macdonald, of your department for shipment to Mrs. Hagino at Tashme. Dates of the shipments are August 20, 1943 and December 6, 1943.
