This property, situate in the city of Vancouver, was declared to the Custodian on the 4th of June 1942 by Ayako ADACHI on behalf of her husband Tsuneichi ADACHI, 1612 West 4th Avenue, Vancouver, B. C. Search at the Land Registry Office on June 13th showed that the title of the property stood in the name of Tsuneichi ADACHI and a Vesting Order was submitted to the Registrar on October 5th for registration.

I have received a letter from the Registrar dated October 6th which, inter alia, reports as follows on the application to register this Vesting Order.

"Tsuneichi ADACHI—This was sold to Sewa SINGH by ADACHI on the 23rd day of July 1942 for \$800 and C.T. 877157A was issued. Do you desire me to do anything further about this?"

It is obvious that the application to register deed from ADACHI to SINGH should have been rejected by the Registrar. However, as the property is valued for taxation purposes at \$825, the transaction would appear to have been made in good faith.

Will you kindly let me know if I should protest against or consent to the registration of this deed.

2. That Tsuneichi ADACHI owned a Westinghouse Console Radio, Model 78D, Serial No. A83257.
3. On the 9th day of March, 1942, Tsuneichi ADACHI delivered the said radio to the Royal Canadian Mounted Police and obtained a receipt therefor.
4. That I have made a most diligent search for the said receipt in all repositories where such receipt might be. I have not found the same and I verily believe that the said receipt has been lost beyond recovery or destroyed.
5. That the sole reason for the non-production of the receipt is that it has been lost or accidentally destroyed.
6. That I have been informed that the said radio has been sold for the sum of \$76.89.
7. That the Estate of Tsuneichi ADACHI, Deceased, is entitled to the proceeds of such sale, amounting to \$76.89.

In our letter of November 15, 1944 we advised you that the B. C.
