

A Judgment obtained by Yasuo Fujita, Shuichi Fujimori, Densichi Uchida and Yasuoto Osho on behalf of Nashua Box Mill against Y. Osho in the sum of \$953.00 has not been settled.

Yasuo Fujita died in 1942 without any apparent estate from which to realize sufficient money to pay burial costs to the U. S. Security Commission. These four persons are at variance with the three Japanese who have been dealt with in their own and Nashua Box Manufacturing Co. files comprising the entire partnership. It may be noted that the Judgment is in favour of Nashua Box Mill, whereas the partnership agreement between the three partners is in the name of Nashua Box Manufacturers, Nashua, N.H., or as currently used, Nashua Box Manufacturing Co.

At the time that the Canadian Credit Box's Trust Association drew the attention of the Custodian to the existence of the Judgment, letters were written to Fujimori (Oct. 23, 1942, December 23, 1942) asking for particulars. Fujimori replied on January 11, 1943 without giving the necessary information. An effort was also made to obtain information from Yasuoto Osho, then and still in the Angler Internment Camp, but without success. The Canadian Credit Box's Trust Association appears to have lost its records relative to the information sent as in 1942.

Mr. Edwards is being asked to search the Court records in order to find out who the parties to this Judgment actually are.

I am not able to provide you with the docket number nor the date that judgment was entered. It is just possible that an error has been made and a Writ only was issued, but in any case I would be glad if at your early convenience you would search the Judgment Book first and if unable to find the record there, endeavour to find particulars of a Writ if and when issued. My chief concern is the identity of the parties to the action and the particulars of claim.
