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
Please note that the above has been repatriated to Japan. At the time of repatriation, the following transactions took place:

He was evacuated on March 12th, 1942.

Life Insurance: None.



Thank you very much for your letter dated November 14th in connection with a claim filed with us against you by H. Furuya Company Limited of \$35.94.

We have referred the contents of your letter to Mr. Ukon Higuchi who states in his reply that "Mr. Kumoi has dependants as stated in his letter but is not the only one working therefore we should ask him to pay \$5.14 which is held as his account".

Our records indicate that you have a credit balance with us of \$5.14 and that the only claim we have on file against you amounts to \$35.94.

We would therefore appreciate your sending to us at your early convenience a cheque for the difference due amounting to \$30.80. As both you and Mr. Ukon Higuchi are in Tashae you may wish to consult with him in this connection. If, however, any other arrangement is reached as between you and Mr. Higuchi, please be good enough to advise this office. Relative letter should be signed both by you and by Mr. Higuchi.

I wish to thank you for your letter of 5<sup>th</sup> inst. in forming me of the refund of the one percent refund. If it is possible I wish you would send the cheque to me, as I am only earning enough to get by on food. I have nine children and I am the only one working. It is awfully hard to buy shoes and clothing and especially in this bad weather shoes are needed badly. I do wish you would send me the cheque if it is possible to do so.

Re. M. Furuya and my debt to them, it is quite impossible for me to pay any debts now. I owe other firms more than I do M. Furuya's, and to this date I have received no notices from them. I was quite surprised to get one from M. Furuya. My debt with them was quite large but I ~~had~~ been paying a little as I can every
