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

Dear Madam:

This is to advise that we have, today, forwarded to you by insured parcel post the camera which you had surrendered to the Royal Canadian Mounted Police.

Shipping costs on this camera amounted to 21 cents, made up of postage of 16 cents and 5 cents for packing costs. We are enclosing 4 cents in stamps, being the balance of the 25 cents which you sent to us.

We have reviewed your file and the file of your husband, and it is noted that you both declared that you owned no property of any kind whatsoever left in the protected area. It would appear, therefore, that the camera which has now been returned to you was the only property belonging to either of you left in this area.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the protected area which vested in the Custodian, and in order that you may confirm this and acknowledge receipt of the camera which has been mailed to you separately, we enclose a stamped, addressed envelope for your convenience in replying.

Dear Sir:

In reply to your letter of February 1, 1946, I wish to state that I have left the following household effects and furnitures in the residence of Mr. K. Shoji, 250 Cassiar St., Vancouver B.C.

Since I was evacuated to a Road Camp I had to leave in a hurry and forgot to mention it to my wife the steps I had taken in storing my property. I believe that is why my wife stated we had no property left in Vancouver.

Some time ago, I heard that Mr. K. Shoji's house was sold by the Custodian, so I had taken it for grant that our effects were also sold. Therefore I communicated with Mr. Shoji, but he informed me that he has received no word concerning my property (that is, whether they were sold or not). If it happens that my property were sold and the money sent to Mr. K. Shoji, will you kindly arrange to have my money recovered and sent to me.


