No. 3. \$30.50 - F. Kranen. This claim you deny, and we are reporting to Kranen what you say. We are giving him your address in case he may wish to write to you about the account.

With reference to your letter of June 2nd, I beg to advise that this man has been interviewed in connection with claims against him by the B. C. Electric Railway, Ryuji KUROMI and F. KRANEN. Mr. Sumi admits the claim of the B. C. Electric Railway and will remit this amount shortly. The claim of KUROMI of \$650.00 is a loan and Sumi advises that KUROMI is a resident at Tashme and an agreement will be arranged between the two of them with regard to this debt. 
