In his declaration to the Custodian July 21st, 1942, this man declared the following assets:

1 - \$100.00 Victory Bond in his own possession. This did not come under the control of the Custodian.

15 Shares - total value \$1500.00 in M. FURUYA COMPANY. The shares were in his possession at the time of his declaration. No funds have been paid into this account from the liquidation of the M. FURUYA COMPANY.

He declared Life Insurance with the Sun Life Insurance Company and another policy with the Manufacturers Life Insurance Company. Both policies were in his own possession at the time of his declaration. These did not come under the control of this office, but, on January 14th, we forwarded to Mr. and Mrs. Takeharu RYUJIN the Sun Life Insurance Company's cheque in the amount of \$182.76 payable to these people in full settlement of all claims under Policy No. 2207493 on the life of Takeharu RYUJIN.

The Royal Canadian Mounted Police reported to this office that Takeharu RYUJIN had surrendered 2 radios and a camera. These articles were later turned over to the Custodian. The radios were sold and the net proceeds from the sale of the 2 radios in the amount of \$38.11 were credited to the account of RYUJIN.

On December 14th, he informed us that the radios were the property of H. SAKAMOTO. SAKAMOTO was later identified by RYUJIN as Registration No. 01931. Therefore, the net proceeds from the sale of the 2 radios are being transferred to the account of Hideo SAKAMOTO, Registration No. 01931, File 11360.

The camera was mailed to Takeharu RYUJIN on January 19th, 1946.

This file reveals no other property of any kind.

We wish to inform you that on January 19th we forwarded to you by insured parcel post the camera which you had surrendered. If you, by any chance have not received this camera, please let us know.

The sum of \$38.11, representing the net proceeds from the sale of the two radios belonging to Hideo SAKAMOTO, has been transferred from your account to that of Mr. SAKAMOTO.

In your declaration to the Custodian on July 21, 1942, you declared a Victory Bond in your possession. This does not come under the control of the Custodian.

You also declared fifteen shares in the M. Furuya Co. No funds have been paid into your account from the liquidation of this company as yet, but when liquidation of this company is complete distribution of the assets will be made.

The Sun Life Assurance Co. policy and the Manufacturers Life Insurance Co. policy which you declared do not come under the control of this office, but on January 14, 1946, we forwarded to yourself and Mrs. RYUJIN the Sun Life Assurance Co. cheque for \$182.76 in full settlement of all claims under policy #2207493.

The cost of mailing your camera to you was 21 cents, being postage of 15 cents and packing charge of 5 cents. We are therefore enclosing 4 cent stamp to cover the balance of 25 cents which you sent us to cover shipping charges.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the protected area which vested in the Custodian and in order that you may confirm this we are enclosing a stamped addressed envelope for your convenience in replying.




