CHATELAIN REPORT

RE: Mr. and Mrs. Tetsuo KAMITAKAHARA

KAMITAKAHARA made his declaration to the Custodian on Aug. 24/42 and was executed on March 11/42. Mr. and Mrs. KAMITAKAHARA declared chattels as shown on Chattel Schedule on file. These are being dealt with together as a number of the articles declared by them are duplicated in their declarations. These goods were declared as being left at 214 Powell St. This property was owned by Dr. SHIMODA, uncle of KAMITAKAHARA.

Mrs. KAMITAKAHARA gave to Dr. SHIMODA, a letter dated Sept. 4/43, giving him authority to negotiate with the Custodian for release of her goods at 214 Powell St. Dr. SHIMODA came to Vancouver and personally supervised shipment through Brown's Storage of chattels to Tetsuo KAMITAKAHARA and to Miss SHIMODA, File 11015. Miss SHIMODA operated a drug store at 210 Powell St. and resided in a four room apartment over the store. We have no complete record of what exactly was shipped to either KAMITAKAHARA or SHIMODA.

The balance of the goods remaining after the shipments had gone forward were sold at auction at 210 Powell St. and some credited to the account of SHIMODA and KAMITAKAHARA respectively. On checking these two files there appeared to be a number of items credited to KAMITAKAHARA which were not declared by either he or his wife. A list of these extra items was sent to KAMITAKAHARA on Jan. 11/47 and a copy of our letter to KAMITAKAHARA was also sent to SHIMODA. On Jan. 21/47 KAMITAKAHARA wrote and stated which of these articles belonged to him and which belonged to SHIMODA. This list was then sent to SHIMODA. He asked him to sign a copy of this if he agreed with the distribution of these chattels. He signed and returned this list to us and the transfer of chattels was made accordingly. The net proceeds from sale of chattels sold in the name of KAMITAKAHARA was \$307.22 and this was credited to his account with the Custodian. (This is net proceeds after transfer of goods to SHIMODA).

The following is a resume of his letter of Jan. 21/47 setting out the position of chattels as far as he is concerned:

Lighting fixture: He states that we have not accounted for a combination wood and gas cooking stove of white enamel which he values at \$150.00. An Empire gas and coal range was sold at auction for \$69.00 and this sum credited to his account. It would appear that we sold this at a good deal less than his valuation.

China cabinet: A secretary was sold in his name. Whether this could be the china cabinet he declared or his bookcase, is hard to say, but I rather think it is the bookcase. In this case the china cabinet was not found by the Custodian.

1 Room bedroom suite: He states he asked to have a bedroom suite shipped but that he only received the bed and bureau and not the vanity and bench. Three walnut dressers were sold at auction and credited to him, and this would account for the vanity which he didn't receive. His wife declared 2 bedroom suites, so the extra

dresser sold would be part of the suite she declared.

Lamps He declares 1 floor lamp, 1 table lamp and one set of 3 small table lamps. He only sold one lamp, so it would appear that the balance of the lamps are unaccounted for.

Silverware He declares silverware consisting of silver tea sets, silver trays, 1 set of bread and butter silver cutlery, silver vases, etc. He values these at \$150.00. The only thing on this list declared in his original declaration was the silver cutlery. This silver was supposed to have been shipped with his china and glassware, but when the box arrived it apparently only contained china and glassware.

Summing up his letter the only things which seem to be entirely unaccounted for are the following:

China cabinet 1 floor lamp, 2 table lamps and 3 small table lamps silverware

However as shipments were made under the direction of Dr. SHIMIZU and goods sold and credited as he instructed, it would appear that the Custodian has no real responsibility in this matter.
