

A cheque in the amount of \$400.00, in full payment of 1 tractor, 1 plow and coulter, 1 disc, 1 cultivator, 1 hiller with beam and 1 set 2 sections harrow, was received from the Dominion Drag Saw Co. Ltd., on March 20, 1943.

The file reveals that Hideo was allowed to go to Eburne and make his own arrangements about the sale of the above mentioned articles. He also arranged to leave in the care of Mr. Dick Jamieson, of the Terra Nova Cannery, 1 washing machine, 1 bicycle and 2 sewing machines - 1 in the care of E. House. The washing machine was shipped on the request of the father, Kyutaro. The bicycle was auctioned and credited to the account of the brother, Keishiro, and we understand from Mr. Jamieson that the 2 sewing machines were also shipped.

It is also noted that Hideo took away with him certain articles - see Schedule. We do not know if this is a correct list or not.

A copy of a covering letter, sent to his brother, Keishiro, is on file.

Dear Sir:

Your file has now been completely reviewed, and we are enclosing herewith our cheque in the amount of \$1,386.00, being the entire balance of your account with the Custodian.

Upon evacuation, your brothers, Shogoro and Setsuo, and your sister, Kazuko, declared certain chattels which were to be left at your father's home. However, this house was situated on property owned by you, and the only chattels found were those situated in your house.

Your brother, Hideo, was allowed in the Protected area in April, 1943, and he sold a tractor, a cultivator, a disc cultivator and miller, and a set of 7 section harrow, in the amount of \$400.00. This was credited to his account and has been forwarded to him. He also took away with him a number of articles.

Hideo left with Mr. Jamieson, of the Torra Nova Cannery, a washing machine, a bicycle and sewing machine, and he left another sewing machine with Mr. S. House. He understood from Mr. Jamieson that these articles have been shipped to your family with the exception of a bicycle, which was auctioned.

Although your brother, Yoshie, and sister, Chisako, declared no chattels in the Protected Area we note, by their files, that they have made enquiries with reference to their chattels. It appears that you are acting as a family group and as we cannot identify the goods removed and auctioned, we have credited all the proceeds from the sales to your account and we would ask you to make arrangements as to the division amongst your family.

Goods were also shipped to your father on his request. A separate cheque is going to your father, covering fishing nets, etc., which were found in his name.

MEMORANDUM.

Files Nos. 10480, 699, 1743, 1739, 11654.

Report on SHIMANO house and property.

This property has been leased to a Chinese named Lam Poy, who has sublet the dwelling house to a white tenant.

As there were so many chattels in the house and outbuildings, which space was required by the tenants, an inventory was taken and the goods moved to our No. 4 storage warehouse in Steveston.

Hideo Shimano, who declared farm implements, had permission to visit the house recently, and sold his tractor plough and cultivator, a disc cultivator, tiller and set of two section harrow, and took away some effects, a complete list of which he promised to send us and has since done so. It was not possible to identify the ownership of all the chattels, so no attempt was made to separate them.

The fishing equipment was taken to the Takahashi Net House to be sold.

A few items were left in care of Mr. Jameson, the manager of the Terra Nova Cannery. Among them are a washing machine and bicycle, and two sewing machines.

There were some farm equipment, such as berry boxes, sacks, sticks, trailers, etc. left for the use of the Chinese, Lam Poy.

The goldfish were left in the pond.

Constable Davidson informed me that he could grant me permission if the custodian has no objection to my going home. Will you please let me go to get these things?

My parents, who are now evacuated in the protected area, also want me to get for ~~them~~ ^{them} their Bibles and other small things.

In the mean time, our house was broken in sometime ago. Something must have been stolen, although we gave them up for lost, as such an occurrence could not be avoided under the existing circumstances. At any rate, I must get these things and look into our house when I am on the coast.

I shall be obliged if you ^{will} answer me at your earliest convenience.

File No. 10480 - Eutene SUZUKI (Father):

Declares nothing but some notes he left in the house owned by Keishiro SUZUKI.

File No. 699 - Mitsuo SUZUKI (son):

Declares effects left in his father's house at Terra Nova Quarry.

File No. 1739 - Keishiro SUZUKI (son):

Is registered owner of two-thirds of the property, together with two brothers, Matsuo and Shigoro, who own one-third between them. The title is in the name of Keishiro SUZUKI.

There is a 9-roomed house, a barn, a chicken house, and woodshed on the property. The household and personal effects of Matsuo, Keishiro, and Mitsuo are in the house. Farm implements, garden tools, and some effects are stored in the barn and woodshed.

File No. 1743 - Shigoro SUZUKI (son):

Declares tools.

File No. 11654 - Mitsuo SUZUKI (son):

Is presently a patient in the hospital at Hastings Park. He declares farm implements stored in the barn and goldfish in the pond.

Mr. Reed has handed me your memorandum of November 17th. I have no objection to your contacting Mr. Robinson and having him make any further check you wish. He is, however, very busy and may not be able to report promptly. We are additionally asking him to keep a record of his time spent on this case since the cost should be charged to the Internee Department.

For his record, we mention that the items given below registered under the name of Keishiro Shimano are now claimed by the daughter, Hideo, an evacuee Japanese. We note that you are writing the internee for his confirmation.

You sent me a memorandum a few days ago, asking for a report on the attached memorandum and "JP" form, which you received from Mr. Spain.

The above named internee is the owner of chattels and a number of Nets. It was one of his nets that we sold for \$300.00 and only on Saturday collected the money, after months of delay.

I find on reviewing a voluminous file that Mr. J.D. Mather reported on this case last April and there is a long list of household goods and tools signed by the internee, including the articles listed on the attached "JP" form.

I would like to have Mr. Robinson, our agent at Steveston, make a further check in this case and, if you approve, will write him to report on the possibility of renting the small farm, although, strictly speaking, I suppose this will come under the Soldier Settlement of Canada, unless we adopt the attitude that they have no jurisdiction with respect to internee cases.

In view of the fact that the attached "JP" form indicates that several items are claimed by Hideo Shimano, I think we should write the internee for his side of the story, and I will be glad to write the Camp Commandant, if you approve of the suggestion.
