No. 08960 the only property reported was his life insurance policy; which did not come under the control of this office. On November 9, 1942, he signed a second declaration in which he reported the chattels which had previously been reported by his wife, File 1722. These dusthels have been well accounted for by shipments or sale by suction. The proceeds of the sale, \$81.59 has been remitted to Brs. TOMINAGA today. The only items declared which have not been accounted for are some old Minds and curtain rods, a box of cushions and miscellaneous goods and 8 saws. In regard to the blinds and curtain rods, these were probably discarded as unsaleable, if they were not included in some of the shipments made. The box of qualitons and miscellaneous goods is believed to be the carton received from Cumberland and stored at 604 Cordova Street on June 9, 1945. Mr. Will is being asked to report on this. Of 12 saws declared only 4 were found by Mr. Batt Brown, and these were among the chattels sold and credited to the account of Mrs. TOMINAGA. Lodak camera was turned over to the Custodian by the RCMP to whom it had been surrendered by TOMINAGA. This camere is at 604 Cordova Street. A Dodge Sedan (1939) which TOMINAGA surrendered was sold for the net sum of \$644.17, which has been credited to his account. The account of this man was credited with the sum of \$4.80 as refund of Sational Decembe Tax for 1942. sewing machine, which was held by the Singer Sewing Machine Company until the outstanding balance had been paid, was shipped in July, 1943 by the

It is recommended and urged that employers supply the employees with a copy of the perforated slip, prior to Warch 31st, 1962, in order to obviate the demands which will other wise be made upon the employer by employees for information concerning the amount of salaries, wages, etc., paid and deductions at the source, which information may be required by the employees in the completion of individual income tax returns.

Instructions to employers regarding completion of Form T-4 Supplementary.

In compiling Form T 4 Supplementary it is requested that the employees' names be listed in alphabetical order and the following instructions be adhered to in regard to the completion of the several columns:

COLUMN I Show name of employer on each individual slip.

COLUMN 2 Show mame and full address of employee.

COLUMN 3 Show whether married, single, widower, or widow (M.S. or W.).

COLUMN 4 Number of dependents.

The employer as to show the number of dependents claimed for National Defence

Tax credit. This does not include husband or wife of employee.

COLUMN 5 Period employed, or "casual", as the case may be.

COLUMN 6 Show total salaries, wages, commissions, bonuses paid by you during the calendar year before Mational Defence Tax, contributions to pension fund or any other deductions have been made. Employers who assume the liability to pay the Income Tax of employees must include the amount in this column.

Column 7 Show as remuneration the amount or value of rent, board, free accommodation, or other allowances in kind made to employees. This is also subject to National Defence Tax and the deduction is to be made at the source and included in the amount shown in column 9.

COLUMN 8 Show amount deducted from employee on account of superannuation or pension fund. The maximum amount to be shown must not exceed \$300.00 even though a greater amount has in fact been deducted. Where Section 5(h) of the Income War Tax Act applies by reason of election, this column need not be completed.

Column 9 Show the amount of Dominion National Defence Tax deducted from the remuneration paid or credited to the employee. The tax must be calculated on the amount shown in column 6 plus the value of free board and living accommodation shown in column 7. (See the "MOTE" following instructions, item 5 (4) on front page.)

Referring to your letter of March 30th to Mr. M. L. Brown regarding Yoshichi Tominaga, #08960.

Mrs. Tominage was in today in this connection and from her statement, I would take it that Kagetsu has not put into the Government the tax deduction and claims that Tominage should do this. However, from my conversation with Mrs. Tominage, I have gathered the following information:

Her husband logged a piece of property under contract with Kagetsu and the Deep Bay Logging Company and the money accruing from the sale of these logs were turned over to Kagetsu, who, in turn made out cheques in the following amounts for the following persons.

S. Kawasaki \$350.60 1-4-798
T. Makimoto 127.57 402/
N. Susuki 321.59 74.
J. Kawahara 328.97 74.

These chaques were turned over to Mr. Tominaga for delivery to these men and Mr. Tominaga assumed that the necessary tax deduction had been made from the money due these men - in other words, thought these chaques were the net amounts due to these workmen.


It appears that Mr. Tominage had only a verbal contract and not a written contract with Eagetsu regarding this legging operation. In the first paragraph of Mr. Stewart's letter, he advises that Eagetsu informed him that the cheques the Deep Bay Eegging Company gave Tominage were for wages earned by him and the usual deduction and remittances were made to the Government. This doesnot seem to jibe with Mr. Tominage's statement that Eagetsu made out and turned over to him, cheques for the four men mentioned above.

Mr. Tominage feels that he should not have to pay this amount of \$73.77 and he is quite definite in his claim that all monice derived from the sale of these logs were turned over to Eagetsu. If there is anything further we can do towards getting this affair straightaned out, I would appreciate hearing from you.
