GENERAL SUMMARY

Re: Thomas FUJIKAWA - Reg. No. 13334

The above Japanese declared no assets when registering with this office, and the only asset appearing on the file was a refund of \$5.00 received from the B.C. Electric Railway Company, being his electric light security deposit.

Thomas FUJIKAWA declared owing an account to the Mission Hospital. However this hospital did not file any claim, but claims were filed by Dr. E.J. Sacrett, Mission, and the Vancouver General Hospital. FUJIKAWA stated at the time of registering that he would try to pay the hospital account from wages earned. We enquired of the two creditors whether any payment on account had been made, and as the debts were still outstanding, cheques in the amount of \$2.50 each were sent to the creditors and they were advised that the Custodian would take no further action in the matter, and collection would have to be made direct.

This file needs no further administration and may now be closed.

The above summary is certified to be in accordance with the information on file.

Dear Sir:

We wish to advise that the sum of \$5.00 was received from the B.C. Electric Railway Company, being a refund of your electric light security deposit. This represents the only asset coming under the control of the Custodian.

In reviewing your file we note that when registering with this office you declared owing a debt to the Mission Hospital. This Hospital did not file a claim against you, but the Vancouver General Hospital filed a claim in the amount of \$66.30 and Dr. E.J. Sacrett in the amount of \$67.50. You stated when registering that you would try to pay the hospital account from wages earned, but the creditors have advised us that these debts are still outstanding, and we propose to pay each the sum of \$2.50 on account and unless we hear from you to the contrary, this will be done within thirty days.

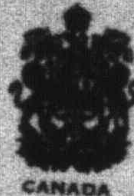
