GENERAL SUMMARY

Re: Kiyoshige MATSUMURA - Reg. No. 10875

The above Japanese declared he had no assets left in the Protected Area in a letter received 7th May, 1943. Two claims were filed against him at this office, one by Dr. H. Uchida for \$35.00 which was later withdrawn, and another by Susukichi YAJIMA for \$150.00. Matsumura was written to about the latter claim to which he replied that the debt had originally been \$150.00 and that he had already paid \$100.00 of it, and he enclosed a money order for \$50.00 in full settlement of the balance owing. The \$50.00 was transferred to Susukichi YAJIMA's account and he was advised of MATSUMURA's settlement.

This file reveals no other liabilities.
