Dear Sir:

The delay in replying to your letter of September 24th is regretted but we now enclose cheque for \$339.47, which as you are aware is the net amount standing to your credit from the sale of your Chevrolet Pickup Delivery Truck. Our statement to you of January 15th, 1943, showed that this Truck was sold for \$365.00, less administrative expenses of \$25.53, leaving the net figure indicated above.

We find there are no claims on file against you, as Dr. H. Uchida withdrew his claim of \$3.00.

Respecting the amount of \$45.00 you stated as still owing to you by a Mrs. Barwell, in view of the fact that you placed this matter in the hands of a lawyer whose name you have been unable to recall, and the fact that you advised us of this debt almost two years after evacuation (and no reply was received from you to our communication of March 20th, 1944), no action has been taken by us in this matter and we have left it to you to deal with Mrs. Barwell direct.

You are aware that you were written many times by this office to fill in our "SP" declaration form. This was finally received by us in February 1944, nearly two years after evacuation. As pointed out in our Protection Department's letter of March 8th, 1944, in the circumstances we can not accept any responsibility whatsoever for the goods you mentioned as being left at 854 West 7th Avenue, Vancouver, where you resided as a tenant. Mrs. Logan, the tenant who was occupying the premises when our representative called in March 1944, informed us that she had been in possession for over a year but nothing of value was left in the house. There were, however, two old white beds of no value, which we confirmed as being useless and were lying discarded in the woodshed. Further inquiries by our Protection Department led to no other disclosures, and in view of your late declaration we are afraid you have only yourself to blame for any chattels that may have disappeared.

Dear Sir:-

We have received yours of February 7th and enclosure. This is the very first communication we can trace receiving from you, despite many letters from this office.

We now understand that both you and your wife claim to have thought it unnecessary to take any steps about your possessions when you were evacuated; you appear merely to have left them in rented premises, although you did not know how long you would be absent and apparently made no arrangements to continue payment of rent.

This action is so very much the reverse of what even the least prudent man would do that we cannot believe that you left anything of value behind. This is confirmed by the present tenant who has been occupying the house for one year and advises that nothing was left on the premises except two old white beds of no value.

While we believe that this matter is not worth pursuing further and that you have no one to thank but yourself for any loss you claim to have suffered, we will institute further enquiries on the receipt of the full name and address of your landlord. Unless we receive this information from you, we shall consider the matter closed.

Finally, we are referring to our Claims Dept. the money you state is owing to you.

Dear Sir,

Early in March last year men under 45 were to leave for the working camps, from the protected area leaving their wife and children behind. As I did not want to part from my wife and children I ~~relied~~^{relied} upon my Alberta friend and came to Raymond.

During that time all sorts of rumors were going about saying that the war will end within six months time. So I did not write down all my property and leave it in the Custodian's charge.

In Vancouver there is such a thing as the Police Court and I do not think that they will allow any robbery done to my property so I have left the things just as they were. I do hope that nothing is missing and the things are in their proper places. There has been complaint from people saying that many of their possessions left behind have been found missing. My friend had also filled in a form and had it checked over but unfortunately there were articles missing. The Custodians had said that they will take no responsibility for the missing articles. But I have faith in the Custodian and I do not hope to receive a letter telling me that some of my property is missing and that you will take no responsibility for it.

Chattels: After numerous letters were sent to the above Evacuee asking for completed "JP" declaration forms, we received one early in 1944, undated. On this form the following declaration was made:

"2 wine armchair and chesterfield; 1941 model Deforest radio; dining room suite including six chairs, table, buffet, china cabinet; Victor gramophone; various kinds of carpenter tools; garden plants amounting to more than \$500.00; 4 shovels; 2 bars; 6 garden rakes; 120 bamboo rakes; 2 potato forks, mattock, 1 pick, pruning shear; 3 gallon Eicona spray; 2 spray pump.

All kitchen utensils which I had in B.C. is all there. I have not brought a thing of that utensils."

No address was given as to where the articles were left but this was presumably at 854 W. 7th Avenue, Vancouver, as the Directory shows this as being inhabited by this Japanese. In February 1944 an investigation was made, as the articles appeared to be of some value, but on interviewing the tenant, Mrs. Logan, of these premises we were informed that no chattels, with the exception of two old white beds, were found there when she came to that address a year previous. These beds were found to be of no value, therefore we discarded them as scrap.

Mr. Green wrote to the above Evacuee under date of March 8, 1944, pointing out that as the above Evacuee did not register these articles when he was evacuated and disregarded our many letters, he had only himself to blame for any loss that may have been suffered. In the above letter Mr. Green asked for the full name and address of the landlord in order to make further inquiries with regard to these chattels, but as the Evacuee did not reply the matter of chattels is considered closed.

Motor-vehicles:

A 1937 Chevrolet Pickup Delivery Truck, License No. (41) C 4112, was surrendered to the authorities in 1942. This vehicle was sold to Fairview Sheet Metal Works for \$365.00 on August 17th, 1942. (See Supplementary Summary attached).

Money Owed to Evacuee:

A Mrs. Barwell, 4655-14th Avenue West, Vancouver, owed \$75.00 to S. Mori. Mori received \$30.00 of this debt and collection of the balance has apparently been left with a lawyer, as no reply has been received to our Form Letter 137 dated March 20th, 1944 in connection with this claim.

Life Insurance:

This file reveals that above Evacuee had a Crown Life Policy, No. 290458, but no evidence is found on file that this policy came into the possession of the Custodian.
