





In addition, Dr. H. HULL of Vancouver registered a claim of \$20.00 against Debtor HULL but this was withdrawn later.

The Provincial Board of Health claimed to be a creditor in regard to Mrs. H. H. HULL, wife of Debtor, but the amount of this claim is not revealed on the file.

The only realizable assets are from the sale of chattels. A credit of \$7.31 in this report is shown on the file.


This Japanese did not register with the Custodian until October 1944, declaring at that time no other effects than his kitchen utensils which were with him at Tokyo. He was evacuated on August 7th, 1942.

However, on July 29th, 1943 he applied for shipment of 2 trunks of clothing and a box of tools which he had left with H. J. Lister, 239 E. 12th Avenue, Vancouver, B. C. These were shipped by the B. C. Security Commission on August 20th, 1943 with the addition of one more trunk. Several boxes and a small chest of drawers were later removed from 239 E. 12th Avenue and the contents sold at our Vancouver auction of November 28th, 1945, realizing the net sum of \$7.35 as per sales sheets on file. This amount was credited to SUZUKI.

The chest of drawers remained unsold in our auction rooms.

Messrs. Storey & Campbell Limited through their solicitors, on April 28th, 1943 advised the Custodian that they proposed seizing a Model 52 Champion 1118 Sticker with Motor purchased by Takuro SUZUKI and on which an overdue balance of \$473.39 was owing.

Regarding your inquiry about certain effects left in care of Mr. H. J. Lister, 239 E. 12th Avenue, Vancouver, B.
