Dear Sir:

Your file with this office has been reviewed and it is noted that in your declaration to the Custodian you stated that you owned no property of any kind in the protected area.

Your file, however, shows that the sum of \$6.42 was credited to your account as refund of wage deductions for the year 1941 received from the Provincial Government of British Columbia.

In her declaration to the Custodian, your wife stated that you had an account with the Royal Bank of Canada, Main & Hastings, Vancouver. This did not come under the control of this office.

Your wife also declared two Monarch Life Insurance Company policies, a Yorkshire Savings & Loan Association policy and a Pacific Mutual Benefit Association policy, all on your life. In November, 1945, Messrs. Campbell, Brasier, Fisher & McMaster sent to this office the sum of \$80.98. This sum was the balance remaining from \$230.11 which these solicitors had received on your behalf upon surrender of Share Certificate No. 3618, Yorkshire Savings & Loan Association, after the deduction of \$149.13 which they had paid to the Monarch Life Insurance Company in settlement of arrears and interest on premium on Policy P29856 on the life of your son. At your request we paid Messrs. Campbell, Brasier, Fisher & McMaster their fee of \$12.50 from your funds in this office.

According to information supplied to this office, the sum of \$421.37 is standing to the credit of yourself and your brother, Yoshizo, in the Yorkshire Savings & Loan Association account. If it is your desire to withdraw these funds it will be necessary for you to forward to the Yorkshire Savings & Loan Association your Share Certificate and a completed cash withdrawal form signed by yourself and your brother. The cheque covering these funds would be payable to yourself and your brother and would be forwarded through the Office of the Custodian.

Your account shows a credit balance with this office at the present time of \$74.90. These funds are free from encumbrances as far as this office is aware.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the protected area which vested in the Custodian and in order that you may confirm this we enclose a stamped, addressed envelope.

PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

File No. 11800

February 20, 1946

Re: Sawaichi IRIZAWA #06992

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on July 23, 1942, in which he stated that he owned no property of any kind left in the protected area.

He later requested this office to apply for the refund of his one per cent wage deductions for 1941, and the sum of \$6.42 was received from the Provincial Government and credited to his account.

His wife (File No. 4575) declared that her husband had a bank account at the Royal Bank of Canada, Main and Hastings, Vancouver, with a balance of \$500.00. This did not come under the control of this office.

His wife also declared two Monarch Life Insurance Co. policies, a Yorkshire Savings and Loan Assoc. policy and a Pacific Mutual Benefit Assoc. policy, all on the life of her husband. On August 17, 1945, Campbell, Brazier, Fisher and McMaster, wrote this office in regard to the cash surrender value of a Yorkshire Savings and Loan Assoc. share. They stated that the value of the Certificates held by this man with the Yorkshire Savings & Loan Assoc. were \$647.90. On November 21, 1945, Messrs. Campbell, Brazier, Fisher & McMaster informed us that they had received from the Yorkshire Savings & Loan Assoc. the sum of \$230.11, upon surrender of Share Certificate No. 3618. They stated that they had paid the Monarch Life Assurance Co. the sum of \$149.13 in settlement of arrears of premium and interest on Policy No. P92856 on the life of IRIZAWA's son (apparently Masaki, born 1935). The balance of the money received was \$80.98, which was paid to this office. From this sum we paid the solicitors their fee of \$12.50 at the request of IRIZAWA. On February 15, 1946, the Yorkshire Savings & Loan Association confirmed the withdrawal of the \$230.11 and stated that an amount of \$421.37 is standing to the credit of the account of Sawaichi IRIZAWA and his brother Yoshiso IRIZAWA. The brother's file is No. 6950. Insurance policies and securities did not come under the control of this office.

The Monarch Life Insurance Company reported three policies: Nos. 113525, 70881 and 92856. The latter, according to information given in the preceding paragraph is on the life of his son.

An extract on this file states that this man holds 50 shares in the Deep Bay Logging Company. These are probably the same shares reported by his wife, who stated they owned an interest of \$2,000.00 in this company. No funds have been credited to this account from the liquidation of this company up to the present time.

This file shows no other property.

This summary is certified to be in accordance with information on file.

Maybe this letter will help to clear up any error or misunderstanding; at any rate please supply me with the information about my personal effects still in your care. (either you still have them or you have disposed of them.)

Regarding my credit balance of \$74.90,

as you state in your letter that this amount is free from encumbrances as far as your office is concerned. Does this mean that I may withdraw the same from your office? If I am able to withdraw this amount, kindly notify me as to what steps ~~may~~ I should take and please send any forms which I have to sign prior to withdrawal of this amount, if possible.

Regarding the Yorkshire Savings and Loan Association amount of \$421.37 in my own and my brother, Yoshizo's name, I should at present like to leave this amount intact and as is. Thank you.

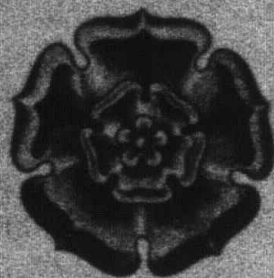

We are in receipt of your undated letter regarding the above parties and wish to advise that under reference 2416/S the amount of \$230.11 representing the full cash withdrawal value of these shares was paid out in November, 1945. There is an amount of \$421.37 standing to the account of Mr. Sawaichi Irizawa and Yoshizo Irizawa (brother). If it is the desire of these parties to withdraw these moneys, it will be necessary for them to forward us their share certificate and we will also require completed cash withdrawal form by both parties before the money can be paid. If there is any further information which you desire, we shall be glad to supply same. We note that you give an amount of \$647.90 as being still standing to Mr. Irizawa's credit, but we cannot find any record of same here. The accounts above mentioned are the only two we know of in which they are interested.

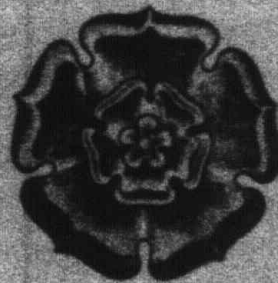
