Dear Sir:

This is to inform you that your camera was mailed to you on March 4th and should be in your hands. If you have not received the camera please let us know. The cost of mailing was 21 cents being postage of 16 cents and a packing charge of 5 cents. This has been charged to your account.

In making remittances to persons residing in the Interior Housing Settlements this office is guided by recommendations of the Department of Labour, Japanese Division. We therefore referred to that department your request that all the funds standing to yourself and Mrs. IZAWA's credit be reitted. The Department of Labour has replied as follows: "We wish to advise that two members of this family are employed in Tashme by this Department and are earning sufficient to maintain the family. We shall feel obliged, therefore, if you will hold intact any funds now in your hands." We are therefore holding the funds in Custodian trust account for the present.

If this situation should change or if you do not agree with the recommendation of the Department of Labour we suggest that you consult the Supervisor at Tashme in regard to this matter.

Dear Sir:

This is to inform you that a radio, which we understand was surrendered by you, was sold for this office for the net sum of \$29.76. This sum will be available to you if you will send us the receipt given to you at the time the radio was surrendered.

The camera, surrendered with the radio, is in our hands and will be returned to you if you will send us the receipt given at the time the camera was surrendered and authorize us to charge shipping costs to your account. Shipping costs will amount to approximately 20 cents.

Salable chattels remaining at Cumberland, after the shipment of various effects to yourself and Mrs. IZAWA, were sold for the net sum of \$29.10, which has been credited to the account of Mrs. IZAWA, and is available to her.

An unsigned declaration to the Custodian appears on your file. In this document are reported a \$50.00 Victory Bond and an account with the Japan and Canada Trust Savings Co. The Victory Bond did not come under the control of this office. The list of depositors of the Japan and Canada Trust Savings Co., as at December 31, 1942, did not contain your name and it is assumed that all your funds had been withdrawn from your account prior to that date.

Your account has been credited with the sum of \$6.09 as refund of one per cent wage deductions for 1941 received from the Provincial Government. This money is available to you.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the protected area which vested in the Custodian and in order that you may confirm this, we enclose a stamped, addressed envelope for your convenience in replying.

Re: Mr. Seiichi IZAWA, Reg. No. 06972

This file contains a declaration to the Custodian dated May 27, 1942. This declaration is unsigned as Seiichi IZAWA had left for camp before his signature could be obtained. Attached to this declaration is a list of his chattels consisting of 16 pieces of effects.

On November 14, 1942, Mr. Matt Brown, Custodian agent at Cumberland, notified this office that 7 pieces had been shipped to these people, leaving 14 pieces in storage at Royston Community Hall. The list of articles remaining in storage was sent to Mrs. IZAWA and on December 9th we received this list back with Mrs. IZAWA's signature confirming that this represented all the chattels belonging to them remaining in the protected area.

These 14 pieces have been accounted for as follows: the range, two saws, garden tools, wheelbarrow wheels, pastry board and one bed were sold at auction for the sum of \$29.10 which was credited to the account of Mrs. IZAWA. The child's bath and stove pipes were discarded and as nothing now remains at Royston it would appear that the other bed has been discarded also. The gramophone and records were shipped on December 30, 1942, and Mr. Brown stated in his letter of February 12, 1946, that the two boxes of effects shown as being in storage in November, 1942, had been shipped on June 24, 1942.

Although the history of the chattels belonging to these people contains a number of contradictions, it is entirely probable that everything of any value has been accounted for, either by sale or shipments, as Mr. Brown has been found to be reliable.

This unsigned declaration lists a \$50.00 Victory Bond and an account with the Japan and Canada Trust Savings Co. The Victory Bond did not come under the control of this office and the list of the Japan and Canada Trust Savings Co. as at December 31, 1942, does not show the name of Seiichi IZAWA, and it would therefore appear that he had withdrawn his funds from his account prior to that date. His account was credited with \$6.09 as refund of 1% wage deductions for 1941.

The Royal Canadian Mounted Police reported a radio and camera surrendered by this man. The radio was sold by the Custodian for the net sum of \$29.76 which has been credited to the account of Seiichi IZAWA. The camera is stored in the Custodian warehouse in Vancouver.

This file reveals no other property of any kind.
