Relative to your letter August 7th, File #11853, requesting reply to your letter of July 22nd re Yoshio Sato. On August 6th our Mr. Wallace wrote you in regard this transaction under your file #4150. However, this information you desired was probably not detailed and we are listing this as follows:

Cost of repossessed cooler.


Dear Sirs:

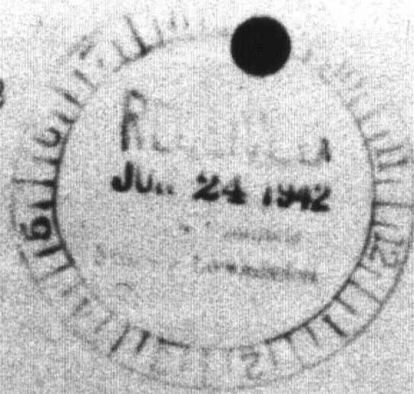
