This policy did not come into the possession of the Custodian, nor have any payments been made from this office in connection with same.



We are in receipt of your letter of August 22nd and have contacted the Mutual Benefit Association here in Vancouver and they inform us that the policy #B-1107 is for \$1000.00 and you are the sole beneficiary. Please confirm that this is correct as we cannot trace any reference on your file or your late husband's file to this policy.

We would take this opportunity of pointing out that we have a claim on file by the Department of Labour, Japanese Division, formerly B. C. Security Commission, for \$80.00, this being the amount due to the above Department to cover the cost of funeral expenses paid by them in connection with burial of your late husband, whom we understand passed away on January 5th, 1945 at Lemon Creek, B. C. We presume you would wish to discharge this obligation to the Department of Labour and if therefore you will kindly sign the attached copy of letter, agreeing to payment of the above \$80.00 from the \$1000.00 due from the above policy, we will pay this amount over to the Department of Labour, Japanese Division, and forward you a cheque for the balance, namely \$920.00.
