The above Evacuee did not declare any personal debts in her JP Form dated July 27, 1942, but a review of this file reveals the following claims were lodged against her:

The claim by Kosura Brothers, being a very small one, was ignored by the Custodian.

On June 1, 1944 we advised Mrs. Nakamoto of the claims by the B. C. Electric Co., B. C. Telephone Company and Walburn Neon Limited, and on August 14, 1944 she replied that she did not owe any of the above claims, that she had the receipts from the B. C. Telephone Company and Walburn Neon Limited, and did not know anything about the B. C. Electric account. She said that before she left Vancouver she sold her business (College Cleaners) but could not remember the purchaser's name.

On August 15, 1944 we informed the B. C. Telephone Company of Mrs. Nakamoto's remarks, also the B. C. Electric Company and Walburn Neon Limited in connection with their respective claims and on October 30th, 1944 the B. C. Telephone advised us that they were dropping their claim against this Evacuee as they were unable to trace one of the parties who lived at Mrs. Nakamoto's old address.

Walburn Neon Limited replied on August 21, 1944 that the amount of \$78.00 was owed on a contract covering a neon window sign and that the selling of her business did not affect their claim against Mrs. Nakamoto, and on August 23, 1944 the B. C. Electric wrote enclosing a duplicate statement of their account to July 24, 1942 against the above Evacuee.

On November 1, 1944 we wrote to Mrs. Nakamoto informing her that we had taken up the matter of claims with the Companies concerned and enclosed copies of their respective letters to us, but we received no reply. We therefore took the matter up through the Department of Labour, Japanese Division, whose representative at Tashme interviewed Mrs. Nakamoto and reported to us on February 22, 1945 that this Evacuee still denied the claims by the B. C. Electric and Neon Limited. She informed us that when she sold her business all contracts in connection with this business terminated as far as she was concerned and said that all obligations up to the time of the transaction were settled in full.

We accordingly wrote to the B. C. Electric Railway Company and Walburn Neon Limited on February 26th, 1945 advising them that we had forwarded to Mrs. Nakamoto copies of their respective letters to us, at the same time enclosing an extract of this Evacuee's reply received by us through the Department of Labour, Japanese Division. We informed them that under the circumstances and as Mrs. Nakamoto had no funds with the Custodian there was nothing further we could do to assist them, and at this time gave them Mrs. Nakamoto's address that they might write to her direct if they so wished.

NO FURTHER ACTION REGARDING THESE CLAIMS WAS TAKEN BY THE CUSTODIAN'S OFFICE.

In her JP form dated July 27, 1942 the above Evacuee declared that a Miss June Campbell of 1937 W. 11th Avenue, Vancouver, owed her \$11.60 and that she held Miss Campbell's I.O.U. for the above amount, which was to be paid on July 10th and 18th. On June 2, 1944 we wrote to Mrs. Nakamoto asking her to let us know if this amount had been repaid but she replied that she had still not received the money owing. We therefore wrote to Miss Campbell on August 24, 1944 but the letter was returned marked "No such address". No further action was taken by the Custodian.

Shares:

An extract on file from a letter from Walter A. Jacklin & Company, dated June 5, 1942, stated that the above Evacuee holds 2 shares in Associated Cleaners & Dyers Limited (File 7822)

June 21/46. Share distribution of \$10.00 credited to the account record through Walter A. Jacklin

Life Insurance:
