That I owned an R.C.A. Victor mantel 7 tube radio, Model No. B4, Serial No. 305, short wave, and that I delivered this radio to the Royal Canadian Mounted Police on the 30th day of July, 1943, and obtained a receipt therefor.

That I have made a most diligent search for the said receipt. I have not found the same and the sole reason for the non-production of the receipt is that it has been lost or accidentally destroyed.

That I, Mutsukiyo YANO, the owner, am therefore now entitled to the proceeds of the sale of my radio.

Dear Sir:

Your account with this office shows a credit balance of \$36.97. This money was derived from the following sources:

The sum of \$7.32 was credited to your account from the refund of one percent Wage Deductions received from the Provincial Government.

A radio which was reported to this office as having been surrendered by you, was sold for the net sum of \$29.65. This money is being held as we have not received from you the receipt given by the Police when the radio was surrendered.

In your declaration to the Custodian, you stated that you owned three \$10.00 War Savings Certificates which were in your own possession. These did not come under the control of this office.

You also declared an insurance policy on your own life and a policy on the life of your son, Saburo. Both policies were in your possession at the time of your declaration. These did not come under the control of this office.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the protected area which vested in the Custodian and in order that you may confirm this, we enclose a stamped, addressed envelope for your convenience in replying.

PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

Mutsukiyo YANO, Registered No. 06987

In his Declaration to the Custodian July 27, 1942, this man declared three \$10.00 War Savings Certificates in his own possession. These did not come under the control of this office.

He declared a Policy of \$2,000.00 with the Sun Life Insurance Company, on his own life and a Policy on the life of his son, Saburo for \$1,000.00. Both these policies were in Declarant's possession at the time of his declaration. These did not come under the control of this office.

On November 12, 1942 this man requested shipment of five items of household effects. The chattels of this family were declared by his wife, File No. 4553 and it would appear that the articles requested were shipped.

The sum of \$7.32 has been credited to this man's account. This money was received from the Provincial Government as refund of one percent Wage Deductions for 1941.

The radio described in the Specified Articles Summary was surrendered to the R.C.M.P. in February, 1942. It was reported to this office by the Police. This radio was sold by the Custodian for the net sum of \$29.65, which is being held until YANO sends us the radio receipt in proof of its ownership.

This summary is certified to be in accordance with information on file.
