FROM: Mr. G. B. Spain

Regarding the chattels declared on this file, the writer visited this school after the thieves and vandals had broken into the building. The place was in a state of utter chaos, but nevertheless I would report my personal observations which would apply to the chattels specifically declared.

The beds were there but of no value and were given to the war salvage. The same remarks apply to the gramophone cabinet (which was damaged and was an antiquated model). The shoe box was a homemade affair. The broken greenhouse glass and wardrobe cabinet were all given to the war salvage. In the confusion there was no trace of china or kitchenware.

The carpets (pieces of linoleum) were perished, cracked and discarded as of no value.
