Mr. Kinzo Fujioka died at the New Denver Sanatorium sometime in the early part of this year according to a report received from his creditor, Sakugoro Fukuyama, as per copy of the latter's letter of May 6th on the deceased's file.

He declared "equipment of fish-cake store, details unknown, probably registered by mother." In addition, a small radio and one set of earphones was removed by the R.C.M.P. perhaps rather unnecessarily from his bedside table.

Reference to his mother's file shows merely a yellow "No Property" card and none of the other children reveal on their files any evidence of the fish-cake store equipment referred to. It may, therefore, be assumed that this was disposed of before evacuation and that the only asset belonging to the deceased is the radio equipment referred to above. In view of the small value involved, this may be liquidated in line with our general policy.
