LIABILITY SUMMARY

re: Shinkichi KIMURA

There are two claims lodged against S. Kimura by the Retail Credit Grantor's Association in the amounts of \$22.93 and \$27.74. These two claims have been marked, on the file, "disregard", so no action was taken by the Custodian.

Another claim was placed against S. Kimura, by the Pacific Coast Creditors Ltd., on behalf of McLennan, McFeeley & Prior, in the amount of \$40.86. Shinkichi Kimura denies that he owes any money to this company. It was suggested by Kimura, however, that he was mistaken for a Mr. Sutesatsu Kimura, formerly of Steveston, who operated a boat building shop before the war. Yoshio Kimura, a son of Sutesatsu, was written to, through the Camp Commandant at Angler Internment Camp, and his reply was received on February 12, 1946. He claims that he did deal with this company but had definitely settled all his accounts. McLennan, McFeeley & Prior were notified of the answer and no further action was taken by the Custodian.

Claim of McLennan, McFeeley & Prior
against "S. Kimura".

I note that \$65.00 derived from sale of keel and boat lumber out of a boat house at the rear of No. 12 House, Imperial Cannery, has been credited to Shinkichi Kimura. It is quite likely however, that this property belonged to Yoshio Kimura, Int. File No. 988, whose father was Sutezatsu Kimura who probably is the man referred to in Shinkichi Kimura's letter of March 8, 1944. It is noted that Yoshio Kimura a boat builder of Steveston, who declared boat supplies in his boat house at B.C. Packers, Steveston, was born in Canada on September 1, 1908 and it is possible that his father Sutezatsu was a boat builder in Canada at that time, whose business Yoshio evidently continued.

It does not appear that McLennan, McFeeley and Prior have been finally advised that the Custodian is not moving further with regard to this collection. Evidently this creditor is expecting that the Custodian will investigate the identity of their debtor which of course we are not bound to do.
