Dear Madam:-We think you will find our enclosure self-explanatory and the only point we have to raise is that we understand you have left two locked rooms in your house at 347 East Cordova. These rooms contain some of your possessions and some of Mr. Shigetaro Kagawats. We draw your attention to the fact that the property of evacuated Japanese vests in the Custodian and we should, therefore, like to know exactly what you have left behind in order that we may take steps to see that the tenants care for your property. For the time being, we have no objection to leaving the two looked rooms as they are but it is possible that a subsequent tenant might require the use of these rooms in which case we should have to open them and remove the contents to storage.
