

MEMORANDUM

Re: Mrs. Genya (Waki) UYESUGI

Mrs. Uyesugi was in to see me the other day with her son and asked why she had not received her Privileged Mine dividends which, with the sale of chattels, gave her a credit of \$78.94. I pointed out that there were outstanding claims from the Beem Products and the City of Vancouver totalling \$93.65.

She claims that she made arrangements with the purchaser of her rowing house business to pay the outstanding City Garbage bill and the balance of her contract with the Beem people. Apparently, however, this purchaser did not do so, Mrs. Uyesugi has nothing in writing to support her claim, and the purchaser has now sold out to another party and cannot be traced.

Under these circumstances, I fear that Mrs. Uyesugi will be liable although she objected strongly, and would not admit these claims. I am sending you the file for whatever action you feel fit, in which connection you may wish to cancel the authority given in letter of May 12th to the Royal Trust Company and collect further dividends until this lady is able to pay the claims against her.

MEMORANDUM

FROM: Mr. G. B. Spain

Re: B. C. Purchasers Co-operative Association

As the B. C. Security Commission had accumulated sufficient Custodian releases to justify the opening of the premises at 573 East Hastings St., I telephoned Mr. McLennan of Morris & McLennan, the legal representative of the Association, and suggested to them that they should bring the key, and accompany the Custodian officials and members of the B.C. Security Commission, to arrange identification of chattels.

At 9:00 A.M. today we all met as arranged and Mr. McLennan with the key attempted to open the front door. This proved impossible as there appeared to be some obstruction inside, quite apart from the bad condition of the lock on the door. Eventually we were able to gain entry through the rear door and were then able to understand why the front door could not be forced. Thieves had entered by the front door, and had placed large planks against the door, preventing the opening of it which would insure their uninterrupted examination of all the chattels, most of which appeared to have been packed in boxes. The lids had been torn off the boxes and contents ransacked and scattered over the floor, and piled up in a state of utter confusion, making shipment impossible. Both Mr. McLennan and the B. C. Security Commission representative realized the futility of attempting to identify and separate the chattels, so the truck was dismissed.

Mr. McLennan called in detectives who made a cursory examination and left without making comments. This particular location is the hangout corner of the worst element in Vancouver.

All chattels were eventually moved to our warehouse and sold by public auction.

Mr. McLennan sent a representative who in company with our Mr. D. A. Smith, spent about one week identifying chattels on the basis of a list supplied by Mr. McLennan. This identification was accomplished only with extreme difficulty.

Under the aforementioned circumstances, the Custodian can assume no responsibility for anything that may be missing.
