These two people have small sums of money on deposit with the Custodian and it is our wish to close out all the accounts possible. A cheque was sent to Mr. Nakayama on December 22nd, 1948 for his balance of \$87.62 and to Mrs. Nakayama a cheque for her balance of \$3.92 on the same day, but both were refused and returned.

Would you be good enough to ask these two Japanese if they will now accept their monies and if so be kind enough to advise us and cheques will be mailed immediately.

There seems to be no reason why Mrs. Nakayama returned her cheque because this amount represents a refund from the B. C. Electric of Security Deposit for light and had nothing whatever to do with the affairs of the Custodian.

Any assistance you can give us will be appreciated.



We acknowledge receipt of your letter of September 9th. in connection with the above.

We wish to advise you that we have the sum of \$3.92 standing to the credit of Mrs. NAKAYAMA's account. This is derived from a refund of B. C. Electric Security Deposit re 882 East Hastings Street. This sum was remitted to her on December 30, 1946 and returned to us, without comment, on March 13, 1947.

Her husband, Shichiro, # 07738 has the sum of \$87.52 credited to his account. This is derived from the sale of chests found at 828 East Cordova and a refund of B. C. Electric Security Deposit in connection with the property at the same address. This was likewise remitted to him and returned without comment.

Mrs. NAKAYAMA did not declare any interest in the bar or shop at 882 Hastings East. This business was believed to belong to Snekichi MIYAGAWA, #05443. However, MIYAGAWA advised us that the business belonged to his wife, Nami, in Japan. MIYAGAWA did declare that his two sisters-in-law were managing the business in the period between his internment and their departure from Vancouver. Possibly one of these was Mrs. Rune NAKAYAMA.

We regret that the funds in Mr. NAKAYAMA's account are insufficient to settle your claim for rent. We would suggest that you obtain a letter of authorization from both Shichiro and Rune NAKAYAMA in order that we may charge this to both of their accounts.

GENERAL SUMMARY

Re: Rume NAKAYAMA, Reg.No.10066

This woman was taken into custody by the police at her residence, 828 East Cordova Street, charged with being in the protected area after October 31, 1942. She was sent to Oakalla Prison, from there to the Immigration Building and on November 23, 1942, she was sent to Tashme, B. C.

On this file is a JP form which carries information about furniture owned jointly with her husband but gives no details of the furniture nor the location of this furniture. This form also mentions a bank account, Royal Bank, Main & Hastings. The JP form is dated November 10, 1942, and it is stated that Mrs. NAKAYAMA had refused to sign this form.

Furniture found at 828 East Cordova was removed to storage on November 23, 1942, and is dealt with in the file of Shichiro NAKAYAMA, XI.1207, to whom the proceeds of the goods removed from 828 East Cordova and later sold have been credited.

The JP form dated November 10, 1942, gives the address of Mrs. NAKAYAMA as 882 East Hastings Street, while an earlier JP form, also unsigned and giving no information whatever about property, gives her address as 828 East Cordova.

In the JP of November 10, 1942, Mrs. NAKAYAMA reports that her landlord, at 882 E. Hastings was Miyagawa, next door neighbour who rented the whole building. The JP form also gives the information that the rent was \$10.00 for the house, \$12.00 for the barbour shop.

In connection with 882 E. Hastings Street, the sum of \$3.92 refund of security deposit for light and gas was received from the B. C. Electric Railway Co. in the name of Rume NAKAYAMA, and was credited to her account.

The premises at 882 E. Hastings Street seem to be those dealt with in the memorandum from Mr. Spain dated December 11, 1942, although no address is given. The memo refers to barber shop equipment and other goods. On December 16, 1942, the stock and fixtures of the confectionery store and barber shop at 884 East Hastings Street were sold to Mr. Robert A. Barrett for the sum of \$250.00. Mr. Barrett apparently was the landlord, as rent was paid to him from these funds. The goods were believed to be the property of Suskichi MIYAGAWA, Internee File 1016, but he stated that the goods belonged to his wife, Nami MIYAGAWA (in Japan) Enemy File 1125. The net proceeds from the sale of these goods (after payment of expenses and claims) amounted to \$109.28, which have been credited to the account of Nami MIYAGAWA, Enemy File 1125. In connection with this equipment, it is noted that Mrs. Rume NAKAYAMA did not at any time state that she had any property interest in any goods or equipment at 882 East Hastings Street. On November 20, 1945, a cheque for \$10.00, was sent to Mrs. NAKAYAMA as a present from Mr. Suskichi MIYAGAWA.

No bank account belonging to Mrs. Rume NAKAYAMA was brought under the control of this office. The account of her husband at the Royal Bank, Main & Hastings, was closed on October 1, 1942, by withdrawal of all funds according to information received from that bank.

This file reveal no other property of any kind. No liabilities are shown in this file.

This summary is certified to be in accordance with information on file.

We are in receipt of your letter of the 17th from which we note that the above Evacuee is making application for maintenance at Rosebery, B. C.

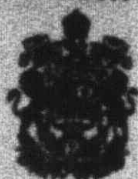

This is considered sufficient and safe storage for the time being until everything is moved at one time to the Custodian's warehouse.
