Dear Sir: re: The Vancouver General Hospital  
and H. Furuya.

I am acting for The Vancouver General Hospital, who, on the 28th of March, 1940, obtained a Judgment against H. Furuya, of 904 East Hastings Street, for \$263.50, which was for Hospital services rendered to Takeru Furuya, minor son of the Defendant. Some small monthly payments have been made from time to time, and there is still \$216.90 owing under this Judgment.

H. Furuya is apparently a citizen of Japan, and his wife, Asa Furuya, would also be a Japanese citizen, although Takeru and Mineru, his sons, were both born in British Columbia.

A confectionery business was carried on by these people at 701 Burrard Street, under the name of the Georgia Confectionery, since on or about the 1st of September, 1941. On or about the 7th of March, 1942, Messrs. Horne, Taylor & Co., Ltd. arranged a sale of this business to Mr. V.H. Hines.

On the assumption that the proceeds of this sale belonged to the Defendant, H. Furuya, I issued a Garnishing Order on behalf of the Hospital and the sum of \$211.90 was paid into Court.

The Defendant opposed my application for payment out of this money on the grounds that the money was not his, but belonged to his wife, Asa, and his two sons, Takeru and Mineru. It appeared from the material filed on examination that this business was a continuation of a business carried on at 1900 Commercial Drive, in the name of Mrs. Furuya. The fixtures and stock were moved from the Commercial Drive store.

The Lease of the Burrard Street property was taken in the name of H. Furuya. He arranged for the sale of the property, and gave the impression to Messrs. Horne, Taylor & Co., Ltd. that he was the owner, and that it was his business. H. Furuya also bought the fixtures in his own name, and signed the Bill of Sale of the business to Mr. Hines jointly with his son, Takeru Furuya.

The Judge, in my application for payment out, held that the Hospital were not entitled to the money, but the money still remains in Court, and, as it now stands, is apparently the property of the Partnership, consisting of Asa Furuya, Takeru Furuya, and Mineru Furuya. Of these, the wife and mother is a Japanese subject.

The Hospital feel that they have not been used properly in this matter, and, although they are unable to so prove, feel that the Partnership was simply a blind to cover up the real ownership of the Defendant, and they feel that this money should be intercepted in some way and not paid to people of Japanese nationality, as the wife undoubtedly is.







4. That the said H. Furaye, is now in arrears two months rent to the 29th of June, 1942, amounting to \$40.00.
5. That the said arrears of rent of \$40.00 are now over due and payable forthwith.

With reference to my telephone conversation with you in connection with two Japanese tenants in property owned by myself. The particulars are as follows:

904 East Hastings Street, Vancouver. Rented to Harry Furuya. Rent \$20.00 per month, paid up to April 29th, leaving \$60.00 owing in advance to August 1st. Mr. Furuya has been evacuated and Mrs. Furuya with her two sons are still occupying the premises.

410 Campbell Avenue, Vancouver. Rented to Mrs. A. Nakamura. At present there is a sign on the door reading, "Send all mail to Hastings Park". No one appears to be living there although the furniture is still in the house. The rental is \$15.00 per month paid to April 1st, leaving \$60.00 now owing in advance to August 1st.

My Real Estate agents, P. C. Gibbens & Co. Ltd., 254 East Hastings Street, Vancouver, filed affidavits supporting claim for payments of rental arrears several weeks ago. These affidavits were left at your office with Mr. Donet.

As I do not feel it is up to me to provide accommodation for these Japanese aliens, I shall be glad if you will arrange for their removal and also for payment of the arrears of rent.

In reviewing your files and registration forms we find the following unsettled claims against you. We are addressing this letter to the both of you as there seems some confusion as to the application of some of these claims. They are as follows:

1. Canadian Bank of Commerce, 1690 Commercial Drive - \$278.40.  
Our records show that a promissory note for that amount was forwarded to Mr. Furuya for his signature and return sometime ago, but that it was not returned.
2. R. Tagashira & Co. - \$646.48.  
This claim is filed against both of you, and is directed to 701 Burrard Street where you apparently were in business as "Georgia Confectionery", according to the registration form of Mrs. Furuya.
3. Vancouver General Hospital - \$216.90.  
This is a judgment against Mr. Furuya according to a letter by E.A. Burnett, Barrister, acting for the Hospital in this case.
4. P.C. Gibbens and Co. Ltd. - \$60.00.  
(Agent for Arthur Nelson)  
This is for rent at 904 E. Hastings Street from April 29th to July 29th, 1942.
5. Dr. G.F. Strong - \$42.90.  
This is in a form of a judgment according to claim filed on his behalf by Messrs. Woodworth and Woodworth Limited.

The foregoing brings these files up to date, and this letter is forwarded at this time to clarify the file and ascertain from you if these claims are correct or otherwise. If correct, what arrangements are you making for the payment of them?
