

And we the member decided to buy a Victory Bond so we bought in the name of T. Nakano, but really it was for our Club. After the war broke out we figured that the Club should break-up. Therefore we decide because of break-up that we sell the Victory Bond and distribute to the member of our clubs which is about 50 people.

If you want to make sure you can check in at Royal Bank of Canada at Corner of Maine and Hastings, sold by Hisakich Tanaka the sum of \$100. And \$100 have sold by Yoshikazu Oura at Steveston Royal Bank of Canada.

With this information I think you understand that \$200 Victory Bond was not Toshio Nakanos.

At one last thing I was the treasurer of the club when we bought the Victory Bond. Thank you.
