In your letter of the 3rd of August 1942, you advised us that no person of the Japanese race under the Regulations may acquire or hold land in Canada, although under certain circumstances the Minister of Justice may grant a person of the Japanese race a license to acquire land.

We have had a further letter from Mr. Nakamura's solicitor referring to the provision under which the Minister of Justice may grant a license to acquire land. It seems his client is desirous of purchasing the property known as 27 Riel Avenue, St. Vital, Manitoba, for his home.

Nakamura was born in Japan, arrived in Canada in 1935, and resided in Vancouver, B.C. He returned to Japan in 1939 and remained there for about four months for the purpose of learning how to sex chicks. He married a Japanese girl who was born in Vancouver, B.C. They have one child, and have resided in Winnipeg for the past three years. He is employed as a chick sexer with J. J. Hambley Hatcheries, 601 Logan Ave.

Will you please advise us the nature of the circumstances under which the Minister of Justice may grant a license, and what steps are necessary to take in order to obtain one.

MEMO TO FILE

The file which was attached to Mr. F. Read's letter dated August 17th indicates that Mr. Toru Nakamura on June 29, 1942, purchased in the name of his wife Lot 27, as shown on a plan of survey of Part of Lot 51 of the Parish of St. Vital, Plan No. 2579, for the sum of \$2500.00, paying \$1500.00 cash with the balance of \$1000.00 becoming due and payable before July 15, 1943. The land was purchased from the Security Land Company, 703 Paris Building, Winnipeg, Manitoba, of which the Manager is Mr. George W. Downey. Mr. Downey's solicitor was Senator John T. Haig of 705 Paris Building, and Downey acted upon the advice of Senator Haig who saw no reason why the sale should not be made.

Previously Mr. Toru Nakamura attempted to purchase land from Mr. W.H. Campbell, 716 McIntyre Building.

This has been declared to be a breach of Order-in-Council P.O. 1457 and James McLaughlin, Attorney-General of Manitoba, takes a very serious view. A caveat was filed and a memorial thereof endorsed on the said Certificate of Title. The Court may order the cancellation of the present Certificate of Title. Penalties may be assessed on both the buyer and the seller.

Re: Toru Nakamura

The above-named is a Japanese who was evacuated recently from New Westminster, B.C. He has lived in Canada for seven years, is married but is not a naturalized Canadian Citizen. He is at present employed here by the J.J. Hambley Hatcheries as a "Chick Sexing Expert" and has been living over one of the chicken hatchery buildings. The place is small, and he is anxious to get a more suitable and comfortable place in which to live and, as he is steadily employed, does not wish to return to the Coast at the end of the war.

He has spoken to his Employer about buying a small place of his own. The Employer, not wishing to take any step that might be contrary to the Regulations Respecting Trading with the Enemy, referred the matter to his Solicitor who in turn spoke to us about it. We told him that, according to our interpretation of the Regulations, there did not appear to be anything to prevent him doing so, unless any new ruling had been made with respect to Japanese in view of the fact that they have all been evacuated from the Western coast; but that if he wished a definite ruling on the matter, we would take it up with you.

We shall be obliged if you will let us hear from you regarding it at your convenience.
