I have received your letter of November 30th regarding claim of Furuya Co. against Nippon Club and by carefully examining the same the situation seems to be a little further clarified.


Up to the end of May, 1942, almost all the executive members of Nippon Club had to evacuate Vancouver and after spending another month with purpose of winding up I also left Vancouver on July 1st of the same year.

However, for some time after that period, the building formerly occupied by Nippon Club had been used as hostel for the various evacuation groups, therefore, it seems to be that certain purchase had been made from Furuya Co. by the said groups under the name of Nippon Club.

Under the above circumstances it seems very difficult to revive the situation after 4 years had already been passed, without receiving any notice regarding above claim during that time, while the club itself is in wound up condition.

I will be very grateful, therefore, if you will give your consideration over the above matter and strike off the above claim as bad debt, however, if you are not in the position to close up the case that way, kindly inform me the full particular of the account.
