PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

May 7, 1946.

Re: Jengoro NISHIMURA, Reg. No. 07413

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on October 7, 1942.

In his declaration he reported a radio being held by the B. C. Police at Port Moody. This radio was sold at auction and the net proceeds of the sale in the amount of \$86.58 were credited to a joint account of this man and his son, as both names appeared on the radio receipt. On June 27, 1945, at the request of this man \$43.29 was transferred to the account of his son, File No. 3489, and \$43.29 was transferred to the account of his daughter, File No. 3500.

In his declaration this man reported a "shingle" machine. This turned out to be a Singer sewing machine. This sewing machine was shipped to NISHIMURA in April, 1943, after settlement had been made on a claim for \$49.00 by the Singer Sewing Machine Co.

This man reported War Saving Stamps at the Internment Camp. These apparently were in his own possession as on February 3 he sent in ten \$5.00 War Saving Certificates for redemption. These were sent to the Registrar of War Saving Certificates and his account was credited with the sum of \$40.55 as cash value. On July 12, 1943, he sent in two more \$5.00 Certificates and these were sent to the Registrar of War Saving Certificates. His account was credited with the amount of \$8.11 as cash value of Certificates.

The account of this man was credited with the sum of \$6.31 received from the Provincial Government as refund of 1% wage deduction for 1941.

The account of this man was credited with the sum of \$5.65 received from the Canadian Bank of Commerce as refund of part payment on Victory Bond.

The amount of \$3.51 was remitted to NISHIMURA on Mar. 1, 1943, and the amount of \$6.61 was remitted to him on November 17, 1943.

The amount of \$49.00 was paid to the Singer Sewing Machine Co. on March 1, 1943, to satisfy a claim against this man.

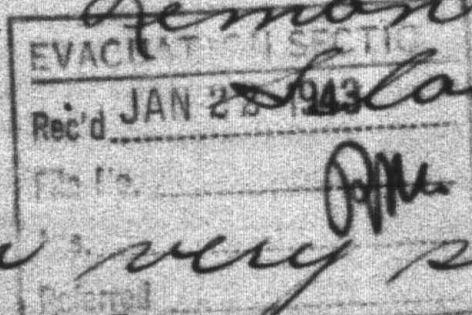

In reply to your letter of April 26th, we wish to advise that your account has been credited with the sum of \$5.65. This sum is the refund of the first payment on a Victory Bond.

The radio, which was surrendered by S. Nishimura and J. Nishimura, of Port Alberni, B. C., has been sold for the net amount of \$86.58. This money has been put in a joint account in the names of your father, Jengoro Nishimura, and yourself. However, radio money is always held until we have received from the owner the receipt which the police gave when the radio was surrendered.

We note that you state that the radio was surrendered in the names of your father and yourself because you were under age. If you will send us the receipt, and a letter from your father stating that the radio was your property and that he has no interest in the money received from the sale of the radio, we will have the radio money placed to your credit.
