GENERAL SUMMARY

As requested in your letter of the 11th instant, file #12120, we are enclosing the registration forms duly completed.

Regarding the claim of the Singer Sewing Machine Company for \$27.00, Mr. Nozaki has produced for our inspection receipts totalling \$110.50, paid to the Singer Company as per the enclosed list. It will be noted, however, that the last two payments show a different account number and receipts were made out in the name of K. Nozaki, as this party is the wife of the above mentioned. It would appear to be due to an error on a part of the Singer Company unless there was a further account, but their contention is that there was only one purchase, namely, the sewing machine.

The original contract was \$114.00, and from this record it would appear that the amount still owing on the machine is \$3.50. Will you kindly have this Singer Sewing Machine Company look up the account again and ascertain whether or not the family is correct in their contention.
