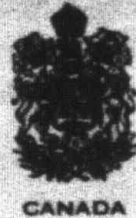


MEMORANDUM TO FILE
