In her declaration to the Custodian, she stated that she owned no property of any kind whatsoever left in the protected area.

However, on November 5, 1943, the British Columbia Security Commission made arrangements to pick up for delivery to this woman a sewing machine left with Mrs. E. V. Ryan, 1676 Bose Road, New Westminster, and this machine was shipped on January 6, 1944.

The file reveals no evidence of ownership of any other property of any kind.

In reviewing your file in this office, we note that you declared no property of any kind whatsoever in any protected area of British Columbia when you registered with the Custodian on August 5, 1942.

However, it would appear that a sewing machine, which you had left in the care of Mrs. E. V. Ryan, 1676 Bose Road, New Westminster, was shipped to you at New Denver, B. C. on January 6, 1944.

From our records, it would appear that the sewing machine was the only article of property left by you in the protected area, and that this has been shipped to you, and received by you. In order that you may confirm this, we enclose a stamped, addressed envelope.
